
Ideas: Reflections






### Bridget Riley

 Bridget Riley is an artist who has created art pieces such as optical illusions, modern art and hard edge painting. She sometimes broke from geometric forms in the 1970s to create what she termed curve paintings, in which waving lines give the impression of undulating movement. This is one of the pieces she created.



# Mary Martin

 Mary Martin was an artist who created art pieces on geometric abstract art .Martin moved towards pure abstraction in the late 1940s painting her first abstract picture in 1950, made her first reliefs in 1951 and her first free-standing construction in 1956. This is one of her pieces.



#### Constantin Brancusi

 Constantin Brancusi is a passionate wood-carver, he produced numerous wood sculptures, often with a folk flavour, and he frequently carved prototypes for works later executed in other materials. He is best known for his abstract sculptures of ovoid heads and birds in flight. This is one of his sculptures.

# Henri Cartier Bresson

Henri Cartier Bresson was a French photographer whose humane, spontaneous photographs helped establish photojournalism as an art form. Henri-Cartier Bresson often used diagonals for composition. This technique is a mixture of the rule of thirds and diagonal lines. Imagine a scene where the subject lies on a diagonal line across the image. I like this piece from Bresson because it is relatable to my initial idea on how I want to reflect anything onto water.



#### Robert Frank

- Robert Frank was a photographer and director who was one of the most influential photographers of the mid-20th century, noted for his ironic renderings of American life.
- He found new areas of beauty in overlooked corners of American life and in the process helped redefine the icons of America. In his photographs of diners, cars, and even the road itself, Frank pioneered a seemingly intuitive, immediate, off-kilter style that was as innovative as his subjects.
- I like Robert Frank's work because its like an inspirtion, considering he made projects in London, which is where im planning to start my project.






#### Elliot Erwitt

 I like these images because they also include puddles which I have worked on before, however these types are different in the sense that there is more than just the puddles and more reflections to add in each puddle.










Reflection Ideas

#### Initial Idea





 I'm planning to go into London to take pictures of the river Thames from the Millenium bridge, this will allow me to start this project.




#### Contact sheet

#### First attempts

 I created these pieces by using the polygonal lasso tool, to cut out the original puddle and replace it with pictures I took from Central London, in order to create my own sort of puddle as if its under the alleyway. However I think I should capture photos of roads almost from a birds eye view, because it will match the alleyway better.












Edited Versions Of My First Attempt

#### Process of practice attempt


• I captured pictures of an alleyway with puddles in the way, and took a picture of the river Thames. This allowed me to combine the 2 by adding the river Thames under, as if it's reflected in a puddle but also is meant to match the perspective in order to achieve the target of making it as realistic as possible.



# Second Attempt

 I tried to recreate my previous attempt with a different perspective as I was expecting the reflections to match the alleyway, however this hasn't gone the way I wanted.







#### New idea Attempt

I tried a different style of reflection as I duplicated the background layer and reduced the hardness of the eraser in order for the puddle to fade with the floor so it matches the perspective.

What I like about this piece is that I was inspired from a picture I used in my mind map of ideas, also I like how I placed the reflection as it creates a realistic reflection, with how the walls and the trees are placed in the puddle. I think that I could have improved this piece by maybe lowering the opacity and possibly adding a shadow, but this was my first attempt and I will not pursue with this idea.



#### Practice Attempt


 I thought of creating a building reflection onto the puddle and I like how the reflection matches the size and perspective of the puddle I created, however I could have improved the edges of the puddle which would have perfected it better. In result of this, I have decided that this has helped me learn how to position and cut the shape and I will move on to a new idea which will be creating puddles with a low hardness on the eraser and duplicated layers to create my own puddles and add In my own effects


# Process of New idea

 I have decided to create buildings by merging different buildings from around London and merging them together to create one big building, as well as reflecting them onto puddles which I will create myself from scratch by duplicating layers and fixing the perspective by slightly aligning the walls and reflections.







**Editing Process** 








# Final piece


