STRONG PASS

Composition

The learner communicates ideas and opinions on the proposals for the park with consistent clarity, with good use of detail, including personal experience. The piece is effective for purpose and audience. For Composition, the first bullet point in the mark band determines the mark given and so a top band mark (9-12 for the longer Task 1) is awarded.

Consideration is then given to the other three bullet points to determine whether the piece merits 9, 10, 11 or 12 marks. How well does the learner handle format, structure, cohesion and paragraphing, as well as register, sentence and vocabulary range?

The piece is well-structured and sustained. Letter format is used, although no sender's address is included. Vocabulary is extensive ('sentiment', 'bio-diverse habitat') and various sentence types are used accurately and effectively. There is a wide range of vocabulary. Paragraphing is generally effective. A mark towards the top of the top band is merited.

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Spelling, punctuation and grammar are consistently accurate. A handful of spelling (e.g. 'deteriation', delapidated', 'definately') and punctuation (e.g. apostrophe misuse) errors prevent full marks from being awarded.
