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Sikhism

There were only a few entries for this new unit. One area for improvement is in response to the part (b) questions which required the development of two reasons. Candidates providing three reasons could only be credited for two of them, unless one was clearly a development of another reason. Candidates should aim to explain two reasons for their point of view as clearly as possible, perhaps by putting each reason in separate paragraphs.

Section 1

This section was attempted successfully in general. However, question 1(c) created difficulties for some candidates who wrote about religious upbringing without explaining how that feature would lead to a belief in God. It is important to address every aspect of the question.

Section 2

There were some thoughtful responses to 3(d) and 4(d). However, some candidates were unable to put forward three reasons why someone might disagree with them. Only one of the six responses to a (d) style question needs to be a reference to Sikhism.

Section 3

This section involves a study of attitudes in a religious community together with the study of beliefs based on scripture or other sources. Some candidates found it hard to identify the range of attitudes to be found within the Sikh religion towards homosexuality, contraception, sex outside of marriage and divorce.

Section 4

The section was answered satisfactorily but there are two areas that could be improved. The first is the study of community cohesion and the second is the tendency to confuse race and faith.

Summary

The answers were pleasing overall and the quality of some responses provided ample evidence of good teaching.
