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BTEC L3 qualifications

BTECs are rigorous, future-focussed, and globally recognised qualifications that equip learners of all ages with the knowledge, skills, behaviours, and confidence to succeed in a modern, skills-based economy. One in five UK working age adults have one or more BTECs, and 6 million learners have achieved a BTEC in the last decade.

The courses are developed hand-in-glove with employers. This approach ensures that not only are the learners set up for a successful transition into the workplace, but they will go into jobs that will help satisfy the UK economy's widening skills gaps. Included in the class of 2022 are many future healthcare professionals, engineers and construction workers who are so vital to the UK's economy.

Level 3 BTECs are globally recognised and continue to be the most popular vocational qualification to support progress to university - approximately 50% of Level 3 BTEC graduates will continue into Higher Education with the rest going into employment, an apprenticeship or further study.

Context of the 2021/22 academic year

This academic year in line with the regulatory guidance from Ofqual the aim was to see 2022 as a transition year to reflect that we are still in the pandemic recovery.

BTEC courses have a different structure and design to academic qualifications – BTECs are modular qualifications (with assessments taking place throughout the course) compared to GCSEs and A levels which are linear (assessed and awarded at the same time at the end of the year).

The aim of all awarding bodies has been to ensure fairness for learners by neither advantaging or disadvantaging any one group of students compared to their peers. Further information can be found here.

As the structure and delivery for BTEC and GCSE/A Levels are different, different mitigations had to be used to reduce the impact of the pandemic. For BTECs the safety nets in place for learners were:

- Unit-level Teacher Assessed Grades (UTAGs) for assessments due to be taken in 2020/21 but could not be completed.
- Streamlined assessment for up to two internal units, depending on size of BTEC qualification taken in 2021/2022.
- Reviewing where grade boundaries are set for BTEC external assessments, after marking was undertaken and in consideration of a variety of factors (including level of demand of the assessments, context in which they were undertaken).
- □ Special considerations for those who miss external assessments and cannot sit them later, or for those eligible whose exam performance was affected.

As BTECs are modular the journey to certification for learners will be different. For example, for this academic year, qualifications which have been delivered over two years, typically a learner's qualification grade will be a combination of unit teacher assessed grades (UTAGs) from 2020/21 and actual assessments completed in 2021/22. Given this modularity the path back to pre-pandemic standards is impacted by UTAGs that are banked in the system, which will also be present for some learners in 2023.

When making comparisons to historical years need to be mindful, as the approach to grading and awarding for the past two academic years has been under extraordinary regulatory conditions and there have also been significant changes in the cohort make-up and size,

As in every year, there was an appeals process in place.

BTEC Nationals (2016)*: Key Headlines

There has been an increase in entries across all qualification sizes as centres continue to transition from legacy suites. The largest increase is in the Extended Diploma (1080 size)

The Extended Certificate (360 size) remains the most popular

Business, Health & Social Care, Applied Science, Sport and Information Technology are the five most popular sectors.

Overall outcomes have remained broadly stable compared to 2021 in courses typically delivered over two years.

Introduction: Understanding the BTEC Nationals (2016)

BTEC Nationals (2016 - RQF) Overview

The development of the new BTEC specifications (launched in 2016) was informed by talking to over 5,000 stakeholders, including teachers, students, universities and employers, and underpinned by research on the best education systems in the world.

These qualifications retain their essential BTEC character - learning by doing - and have evolved to meet changing needs by including:

- some externally assessed units (practical tasks and written tests) which better prepare learners for university-level courses and taking professional qualifications in the future.
- a larger foundation of mandatory content studied by all learners, so employers and universities know what to expect from a BTEC-qualified candidate.
- The new BTEC specifications were developed to meet the requirements set by Department for Education (DfE) to be counted as Applied General and Tech Level qualifications, for example by including the required proportion of external assessment.
- Certain BTEC Nationals Specifications have been available for teaching since 2019 which are not Applied General and Tech Levels, but which are highly practical and progression focused. They feature large, flexible teaching modules and are 100% internally assessed.
- The information contained here gives some top-line indications of performance in what is the second or third year for some qualifications and the first year for others. Where this is the first year, and possibly also where this is the second, the patterns of registration and performance are likely to be atypical and not representative of future years.

Introduction: Understanding BTEC Nationals (2016) Results

Data definitions

The results publication for the BTEC Nationals (2016) only reports outcomes for completed qualifications. This is different from the data rules used for the BTEC Nationals (2010) and the BTEC Firsts, where results are reported based on projected completions. This means these results for the BTEC Nationals (2016) refer to those people claiming this academic year rather than being dependent on a projected length of course.

What is a completion? - In these results, a completion refers to qualifications where a learner has been awarded a grade for the qualification, which can include U (unclassified).

What is a Pass? – These results also show figures for learners who have passed the qualification (achieved a Pass grade or above). Learners who have completed but not passed are awarded U. To pass, learners must have completed the qualification, passed the externally assessed units and achieved the required number of points on the mandatory units and the qualification as a whole.

Rounding Numbers in these slides are generally rounded to the nearest multiple of 100. Smaller numbers may be rounded to the nearest 10.


The 2021-22 academic year



Cohort Overview


This graph shows the number of learners completing each of the qualification sizes in 2021/22.

Two-year courses saw a steady increase in 2021/22 compared to the previous year, with the Extended Diploma seeing the most significant growth.

The Extended Certificate is the most popular size qualification for the BTEC Nationals (2016). Most learners take it as a two year course. These qualifications are often taken alongside A levels to provide a broader curriculum, developing learners' employability and soft skills.


Students continue to complete a BTEC to pursue careers in STEM

Other STEM subjects, including Applied Psychology, have seen significant increases in the number of completions.



Gender differences exist among subject choice


BTEC Nationals (2016): 2021/22 most popular five sectors by volume and gender

BTEC Nationals (2016): most popular 5 sectors for female learners by completion volume





BTEC Nationals (2016) achievement: grades explained

Learners who pass the BTEC Nationals (2016) are awarded grades using the range from Pass (P), the lowest qualifying grade, up to Distinction Star (D*) the highest.

Learners passing the Certificate (180GLH), Extended Certificate (360 GLH) and Foundation Diploma (510/540 GLH) are awarded single grades, e.g. D.

Learners passing the Diploma (720 GLH) are awarded double grades,

e.g. DM. Those passing the Extended Diploma (1080 GLH) are awarded triple grades, e.g. DDM.

Learners who have not met the standard for Pass are graded U (Unclassified) on all sizes of the qualification.

NB a reminder we introduced the Near Pass (N grade) for most BTEC Nationals (RQF, first teaching from 2016) external assessments, meaning learners can pass the qualification without passing the external assessment as long as they achieve the N grade and meet all other eligibility requirements (which remain unchanged).
