What's changing?

The new specification for AS and A level Politics 2017 affects the content within the qualification – these changes will affect all awarding bodies.

Content changes:

- Increased content, including voter behaviour, constitutional history and the role of the media.
- Reduced content on the role of, and key issues, affecting the European Union.
- New content including key ideas and thinkers of the political ideas of Conservatism, Liberalism and Socialism.
- A choice of content routes at A level.

Familiar specification within a clear and coherent structure

Our new specification will be familiar and manageable, with new components introduced within a straightforward structure.

A wide range of engaging and contemporary issues

Our qualification includes a broad range of relevant and contemporary ideas, institutions, processes and issues to support students' learning about Politics.


