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Information for current OCR centres

The information in this document is relevant if you are currently teaching the OCR AS level and A2 in Art and Design, and you intend to teach the 2015 Edexcel AS and A levels in Art and Design from September 2015.

Because of the nature of the subject, changing to a different specification should only have a relatively small impact on your delivery of the course. The 2015 AS and A level subject content has been reviewed and refreshed to reflect current practice but you will be encouraging students to develop the same creative and critical skills. For you, the biggest changes will be the assessment grids and the format of the Externally Set Assignment.

Qualification structure

You are already familiar with a two-unit AS level and a two-unit A2, and the 2015 Edexcel AS and A levels in Art and Design each comprise two components: a Personal Investigation and an Externally Set Assignment. At AS, the component weightings are slightly different from the unit weightings you are used to, but we say more about this in the table below.

The AS and the A level are now separate qualifications, so marks achieved at AS will not contribute towards the A level mark and grade.

However, work completed and assessed as part of a student's AS Personal Investigation **can** form part of a student's Personal Investigation submission for A level Art and Design.

It is important to bear in mind that:

- The A level standard is higher than the AS standard, so the performance expected of students at A level is different to the performance expected of students at AS.
- Any AS work that forms part of an A level submission will be assessed at the A level standard.

Externally Set Assignment (ESA)

When you look at the Externally Set Assignment sample assessment materials for the 2015 Edexcel AS and A levels, you will notice small differences both in the style of the papers, and the period of sustained focus at AS.

The current OCR Externally Set Assignment paper comprises different sections, each containing different starting points. With the exception of students doing the Critical and Contextual Studies endorsed title, all starting points are intended to be appropriate for any endorsement.

There is also one Externally Set Assignment paper issued for each of the 2015 Edexcel AS and A levels. The paper contains one broad theme followed by suggested starting points grouped by title, though students doing any title can use any of the starting points.

The period of sustained focus in the current OCR AS level is 5 hours. The period of sustained focus in the new Edexcel AS is 10 hours, which gives your students longer to produce their final outcome(s).

Assessment grids

The AS and A2 assessment grids you are used to using are based on the four Assessment Objectives and have a total of 100 marks available for each unit.

Mapping for current OCR centres

The main assessment grid for the 2015 Edexcel GCE is based on the four new Assessment Objectives, and has a total of 72 marks available. This grid is used for marking all practical work and written annotations at both AS and A level.

We also have a separate assessment grid with a total of 18 marks available for marking the personal study (part of the Personal Investigation at A level).

The table on the following pages captures the similarities and differences between the 2008 OCR GCE in Art and Design, and the 2015 Edexcel GCE in Art and Design.

The personal study is marked using a second assessment grid.</p>	<p>The separate assessment grid for the personal study allows you to give discrete marks for the A level written component, something teachers have told us they want to be able to do.</p>
