Activity – Marking of Coursework Folders

Purpose:

- To apply the mark scheme to a range of responses both in creative fiction and non-fiction as well as the candidates' own commentaries

Folders 1 and 2

Read Folders 1 and 2 as examples of typical folders across the mark range. These are to set the standard and allow you see two very different outcomes.

What are the particular strengths of this work?

Apply the mark scheme to the specific parts of the folder to see how the final mark has been arrived at.

Folders 3 – 5

Read each folder

Apply the level descriptors to arrive at a final mark for each folder.

There will be three marks in total, two marks of 18 for the creative pieces making a total of 36 and a mark out of 24 for the commentary.

The total coursework mark is out of 60.

Folders 6-7 (takeaway)

Additional folders have been included as examples of submissions which also might be helpful in terms of the range of marks. Both are ambitious and allow the candidates to explore their own ideas within the specification. As with Folders 1-2, the outcomes are very different.
