This notice has been issued to raise awareness of the enforcement of bus lanes. From 14th July 2008, Sheffield City Council is re-commencing the enforcement of the bus lanes across the city. Following the recent decision by the Traffic Penalty Tribunal, improvements have been made to the road markings in accordance with the Adjudicator's advice.

The Council is issuing motorists who have contravened the regulations with warning notices like this one to advise them of the enforcement which is taking place. After a two month warning period commencing 14th July 2008, any unauthorised vehicle captured by CCTV using the bus lane during restricted hours may receive a Penalty Charge Notice of £60.00.

One of the aims of this initiative is to enable Sheffield City Council to ensure that traffic flows more freely, public transport can keep to timetable, and congestion within these areas is visibly reduced, thereby improving road safety and having a positive impact on the environment by reducing CO2 emissions.

Alternative routes are signposted prior to all Bus Gates and motorists should take note of the signs and comply with their directions.
