

Getting ready for summer 2023 A level results

I wanted to remind you how to access some documents and services that you may need during the May/June 2023 exam results period.

Free access to scripts service

From **17 August 2023** until **15 December 2023**, you will be able to view and download scripts which have been marked online free of charge using our [Access to Scripts](#) service.

The Portal can only be accessed by Edexcel Online users who have the *Exam Viewer* profile ticked on Edexcel Online. Exams officers give teachers access to *Exam Viewer*.

As exams are summative, rather than formative assessments, scripts do not generally have examiner annotation on them. The marked script allows teachers to evaluate how the student performed on particular questions in relation to what they have been taught; the Examiners' report and the exemplars that we make available demonstrate how the mark scheme is applied.

If scripts have been marked 'traditionally' (i.e. not online), you will need to request them, free of charge, by **15 December 2023**, via the *Post Results* section of Edexcel Online.

Candidate consent

Candidate consent is required before requesting script copies, as per section 4.2 of the JCQ's [Post-results services guide](#). **Candidate consent can only be obtained after results have been published.**

Understanding grade boundaries: scaling on A levels

The raw mark total (that achieved by adding together the marks available for each component as listed in the specification) for most A level and 1 AS component is different to the subject mark total. The raw marks for each component need to be scaled and then added together to achieve the subject mark. The notional, paper level grade boundaries reflect the unscaled totals. Please click into the calculator in the 'subject' and 'qualification boxes' (once downloaded) to change to the A level you require.

Individual moderator reports for A level coursework (NEA)

From results day you can download centre-specific moderator feedback for your coursework components:

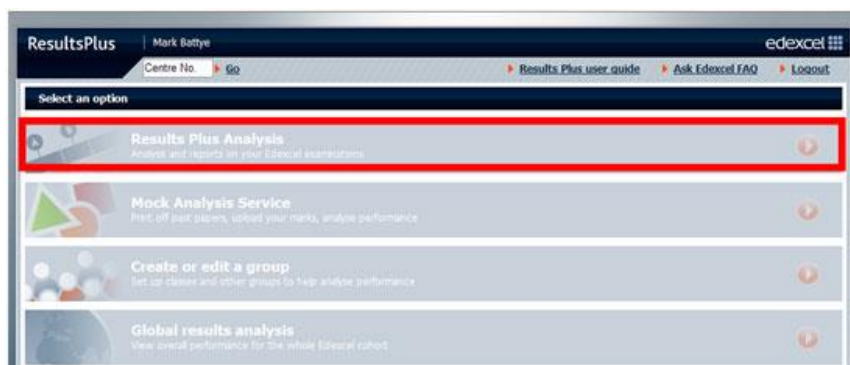
- Log in to [Edexcel Online](#). If you've forgotten your password you can generate a reminder by selecting 'forgot password'
- Click on 'home'.
- Select 'GCE' from the qualification drop down on the left.
- Hover over 'Results' and select 'Moderator Reports'
- Select 'June 2023' from the 'Select a Session' dropdown.
- Select your A level coursework component from the subject dropdown.
- 'Moderator Report' will self-select.
- Click 'submit'.
- Your moderator's report will appear in your Edexcel Online mailbox within 30 minutes.

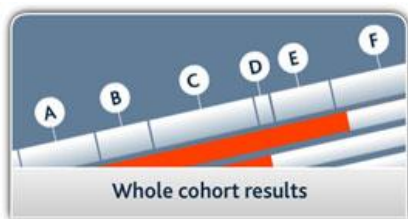
Moderators' reports

You can also download the general moderators' reports (for all centres) from [ResultsPlus](#) on results day:

1. Go to [ResultsPlus](#) and sign in using your Edexcel Online username and password. If you've forgotten your password you can generate a reminder from [Edexcel Online](#).
2. Once you are logged in under your centre, select '**ResultsPlus Analysis**'.



3. Then select '**Whole cohort results**' followed by '**Cohort paper analysis**'.



4. Select '**GCE**' and '**June 2023**', followed by the relevant subject and '**View paper analysis**' for your coursework component. Because it is an internally assessed unit there will not be any paper analysis available, but if you select '**Exam docs**' you will find the Moderators' Report for that component.

Reviews of marking (RoMM)

If you're not happy with your students' results this summer, you should take the following steps:

- View the grade boundaries, question papers, mark schemes and examiners' reports of the paper/qualification concerned.
- View your students' scripts using the free access to scripts service.
- Log in to [ResultsPlus](#) to see how your students have performed on every question and compare their performance to the national average.
- If you're still unhappy with your students' results, you may apply for a review of marking via our post-results services. You can [access guidance on everything you need to know about results day and post-results services](#).

How to apply for post-results services

Please speak to your exams officer if you wish to proceed with a review of marking. Exams officers should contact their Centre Account Specialist on 0344 463 2535 if they require guidance, [read this guidance](#), or view this [video](#). All applications for reviews of marking must be submitted through [Edexcel Online](#).

Why are reviews of marking results sometimes received very quickly?

Senior examiners who carry out reviews of marking are re-trained prior to commencing reviews. As soon as you submit a request for a review of marking on Edexcel Online, the script is sent to the allocated senior examiner electronically. If they are sitting at their desk, they could receive the script and start reviewing it within minutes of your request.

Appeals

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of a review of marking, you may wish to appeal against the decision. We will allow the head of centre (or designated member of the centre's senior management team or examinations manager) 30 calendar days from the receipt of the outcome of the review of marking, during which an appeal may be lodged by sending an email to the following address: edexcelappeals@pearson.com.
