Question 1

How far does Source 3 challenge the impression given in Sources 1 and 2 that the Battle of the Somme had achieved worthwhile objectives?

Explain your answer, using the evidence of Sources 1, 2 and 3.

(b) (i) Use Sources 4, 5 and 6 and your own knowledge.

Do you agree with the view suggested in Source 5 that the main factor preventing the press from publishing ‘bad news’ during the Boer War was censorship by the military authorities?

Explain your answer, using Sources 4, 5 and 6 and your own knowledge.

Do you agree with the view that ‘the war changed very little for women’ (Source 7, line 38)?

Do you agree with the view that, at the end of the nineteenth century, winning the vote for women seemed to be 'further away than ever' (Source 18, line 43)?

Explain your answer, using Sources 16, 17 and 18 and your own knowledge.
