The source is mainly valuable for revealing the reasons for the opposition to the Contagious Diseases Acts by the ladies association for the repeal of the Contagious Diseases Acts and the nature of the responses to the publication of its manifesto, however there are also aspects to the source which hold no value in relation to the ~~the~~ question.

An example of the source being valuable in regards to revealing reasons for opposition to the Contagious Diseases Acts from the ladies association, is shown in the first paragraph of the source, where it states "The Acts put women's reputation, their freedom, and their persons in the power of the police" and "it also states "We enter our solemn protest against these acts because, so far as women are concerned, they remove every guarantee of personal security which the law has established and had sacred". These show



that the source holds value as it lists the reasons why the ladies association, are opposing ~~the~~ against the contagious diseases acts.
