first expedition to Wales was, in which used to gain land and become allies with Owain and Rhys. In the first expedition, Owain was a very strong leader, in which gave a battle to Henry, and was unwilling to lose. Owain and Henry in end made a compromise to in which Henry and Owain had a risky relationship and Henry walked away with the North of Wales. In Scotland, Henry in 1158 ~~he~~ fought to capture the south of Scotland and ~~was~~ also have a base relationship with Malcome, a Scottish leader. Furthermore ~~by 1174, William the lion heart, became ruler, in which was Henry's son therefore~~ both ~~of~~ were the strength of Henry's ^{force} to show the ruler. In Scotland, Malcome agree to be with Henry as Henry had a stronger and larger force, in which Malcome knew he couldn't beat. In ~~the~~ 1165, the 3rd expedition Henry used 30,000 soldiers to ambush, to show strength.



However its inaccurate to state similar policys because of the change throughout the Welsh expedition. In the second expedition in 1163, Henry and Rhys's relationship was unstable, this is because Henry ~~were~~ captured Rhys to show strength. Also in the third expedition in 1165, Henry also used more force, in, which 30,000 force was used in poor conditions of rain to lead to failure. Whereas in 1174, Henry crowned William the lion heart as ruler, making Scotland largely under Henry's reign, whereas Wales were very weak ~~weak~~ control, however having a compromise. Furthermore with Malcome, he gained allies, like Normandy, and also gave Henry ~~more~~ to help him.

Overall I feel the expeditions weren't exactly similar ~~in~~, however having many different techniques the



same, for example the first gain of land and strength of force, made the policies very similar.
