Aims of the session

Recap on key elements of Component 3

- Component three is one of two NEA components
- 40 marks/15% of the qualification
- Can be performed as a player/performer or coach in one activity from the agreed list in the specification
- Generic criteria found in the specification and activity-specific criteria in the Practical Performance Assessment Criteria

Recap on key elements of Component 3 (cont.)

- Five mark bands for levels of performance, from basic to outstanding
- Eight marks at each make band
- Performers assessed based on quality of skills, techniques and decision making that are applied in a competitive setting
- Coaches assessed on quality of planning, organisation and delivery

Recap on the process of making a practical assessments

- First impressions should be based on the performance as a whole
- Refer to the specification and the activity-specific criteria
- Consider the balance of evidence of skills to formal performance
- Context of the performance
- Identify the mark band that best fits your observations
- Check your initial thoughts with a colleague
- Refine the mark within the band

Awarding marks to a performance

- **Task:**
- You are now going to watch a recording of a team performance, in this case handball.
- You will see the assessment criteria for A Level handball, and hear an explanation about the marks awarded.

Key points relating to assessment for this series

- All evidence to be submitted via video format as there are no live moderations.
