

## Pearson Edexcel Level 3 Advanced GCE in Physical Education (9PE0) Summer 2022 assessment arrangements

On the 16 June, Ofqual published the outcome of the 2022 NEA and fieldwork consultation. This set out their proposals to carry forward the arrangements which were put in place in 2021 to take account of public health restrictions that could have had an impact on the way assessments were carried out.

Ofqual announced on 30<sup>th</sup> September changes to the 2022 Summer examination series. The changes are an interim measure to address any impact COVID-19 has had/will have on students taking their examination in 2022.

The changes announced have had an impact on this qualification. The information below details what changes have been made to our specification for students taking their final examinations in Summer 2022.

The changes outlined in this document are correct as of the 30/09/2021.

### Summary of the current assessment/content arrangements

The qualification consists of two externally-examined papers and two non-examined assessment components.

In Component 3: Practical Performance we carry out visiting or remote moderation.

### Summary of the Summer 2022 assessment/content arrangements

The qualification consists of two externally-examined papers and two non-examined assessment components – no changes from the current arrangement.

In Component 3: Practical Performance, UK centres will be offered the choice of a visit or remote moderation. A contingency is in place and will be done remotely if visiting moderation cannot be delivered. International centres will have to submit digital evidence only.
