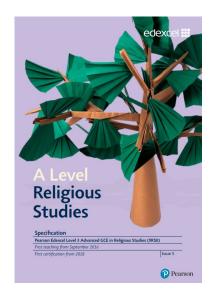




#### **About this resource**

This resource aims to provide clear and user-friendly level descriptors for the 30-mark 'Evaluate' question. It details the criteria required to achieve levels 1 to 5, with comprehensive descriptions of the specific actions and knowledge students need to demonstrate at each level.

#### Level 1 (1-6 marks)

Command word	Definition	Asses: Object	sment ctives
Evaluate	Review/analyse information, bringing it together to form a conclusion/judgement based on strengths/weaknesses, alternatives, relevant data or information. Come to a supported judgement of a subject's qualities and relation to its context.	5 AO1	25 AO2

Descriptor	Student friendly descriptor
A narrow range of knowledge, specialist language and terminology are selected but are unlikely to be used appropriately or accurately (AO1*).	The student unpicks the question and includes a narrow range of <b>knowledge</b> . They select and use <b>specialist language</b> which may be used inaccurately.
Information/issues are identified (AO2).  Makes basic connections between a limited range of elements in the question (AO2).	The student notices information/issues and finds basic <b>links</b> between a few parts of the question.
Judgements are supported by generic arguments (AO2).	Some <b>judgements</b> are backed up by basic reasons.
Judgements made with no attempt to appraise evidence (AO2).	There is no attempt to <b>appraise</b> evidence.
Conclusions are provided but are simplistic and/or generic (AO2).	Simple/generic <b>conclusion/s</b> are given.
N.B. Students who only achieve against assessment objective 1, <b>cannot</b> score above Level 1.	





### **Level 2 (7-12 marks)**

Evaluate	Review/analyse information, bringing it together to form a conclusion/judgement based on strengths/weaknesses, alternatives, relevant data or information. Come to a supported judgement of a subject's qualities and relation to its context.	5 AO1	25 AO2

Descriptor	Student friendly descriptor
A limited range of knowledge, specialist language and terminology are selected, some of which are used appropriately with some inaccuracies (AO1)*.	The student unpicks the question and includes a limited range of <b>knowledge</b> . They select and use <b>specialist language</b> which may include some inaccuracies.
Deconstructs religious information/issues (AO2).  Makes connections between a limited range of elements in the question (AO2).	They unpick the issue, finding <b>links</b> between a few parts of the question.
Judgements of a limited range of elements in the question are made (AO2).	Some <b>judgements</b> are made but are limited.
Judgements made with little or no attempt to appraise evidence (AO2).	There is little or no attempt of <b>appraisal</b> of evidence.
Conclusions are provided, which loosely draw together ideas but with little or no attempt to justify (AO2).	<b>Conclusions</b> are given that loosely connect ideas, but don't really explain why.





### Level 3 (13-18 marks)

Evaluate	Review/analyse information, bringing it together to form a conclusion/judgement based on strengths/weaknesses, alternatives, relevant data or information. Come to a supported judgement of a subject's qualities and relation to its context.	5 AO1	25 AO2

Descriptor	Student friendly descriptor
A range of knowledge, specialist language and terminology are selected, most of which are used appropriately with some inaccuracies (AO1).	The student unpicks the question and includes a range of relevant <b>knowledge</b> to address many but not all elements of the question.  They select and use relevant <b>specialist language</b> which may have some inaccuracies.
Deconstructs religious information/issues, which lead to a simplistic chain of reasoning (AO2).  Makes connections between many but not all of the elements in the question (AO2).	They unpick the issue, examining the key relevant areas and provide simplistic chains of reasoning.
Judgements of a limited range of elements in the question are made (AO2).	Some <b>judgements</b> are made.
Judgements are supported by an attempt to appraise evidence (AO2).	There is an attempt to <b>appraise</b> evidence.
Conclusions are provided, which logically draw together ideas and are partially justified (AO2).	<b>Conclusions</b> are provided by partially justified.





### Level 4 (19-24 marks)

Evaluate	Review/analyse information, bringing it together to form a conclusion/judgement based on strengths/weaknesses, alternatives, relevant data or information. Come to a supported judgement of a subject's qualities and relation to its context.	5 AO1	25 AO2

Descriptor	Student friendly descriptor
A wide range of knowledge, specialist language and terminology are carefully selected, most of which are used appropriately and accurately throughout (AO1).	The student unpicks the question and includes a wide range of relevant <b>knowledge</b> to address most elements of the question. They select and use relevant <b>specialist language</b> correctly.
Deconstructs religious information/issues leading to coherent and logical chains of reasoning (AO2).  Makes connections between a wide range of elements in the question (AO2).	They unpick the issue, examining the key relevant areas in detail and develop many points but not all to achieve <b>chains of reasoning</b> .
Constructs coherent and reasoned judgements of many but not all of the elements in the question (AO2).	<b>Judgements</b> are supported by chains of reasoning.
Reasoned judgements are supported by the appraisal of some evidence (AO2).	They <b>appraise</b> most of the points made, discussing the validity and success of the evidence/arguments, keeping the answer sustained and focused throughout.
Convincing conclusions are provided, which fully and logically draw together ideas and are partially justified (AO2).	They give convincing <b>conclusions</b> , pulling together the whole answer which partially justifies the final judgement.





#### Level 5 (25-30 marks)

Evaluate	Review/analyse information, bringing it together to form a conclusion/judgement based on strengths/weaknesses, alternatives, relevant data or information. Come to a supported judgement of a subject's qualities and relation to its context.	5 AO1	25 AO2

Descriptor	Student friendly descriptor
A wide range of knowledge, specialist language and terminology are carefully selected and used appropriately, accurately and sustained throughout (AO1).	The student unpicks the question and includes a wide range of relevant <b>knowledge</b> to address all elements of the question. They select and use relevant <b>specialist language</b> correctly
Critically deconstructs religious information/issues leading to coherent and logical chains of reasoning (AO2).  Makes connections between the full range of elements in the question (AO2).	They unpick the issue, examining the key relevant areas in detail and develop points fully to achieve <b>chains of reasoning.</b>
Constructs coherent and reasoned judgements of the full range of elements in the question (AO2).	<b>Judgements</b> are supported fully by chains of reasoning.
Reasoned judgements are fully supported by the comprehensive appraisal of evidence (AO2).	They <b>appraise</b> the points made, discussing the validity and success of the evidence/arguments and keep the answer sustained and focused throughout.
Convincing conclusions are provided which fully and logically draw together ideas and are fully justified (AO2)	They provide considered <b>conclusions</b> , pulling together the whole answer and justifying the final judgement. They include a <b>synoptic link</b> to another element of the A level course*.

\*N.B. Students **must** show links to other areas of their course to achieve marks above Level 4.
