From a letter written by Henry VII
to his counsellor, Sir Gilbert Talbot,
September 1497.

By the King, Henry

To our trusted and well-beloved knight,
Sir Gilbert Talbot

Trusted and well-beloved knight, we
greet you well. We write to tell you 5
that Perkin Warbeck and his wife were
lately driven out of the country and
forced to set sail by the King of Scots.
After that, though, they landed within 10
our land of Ireland, among the wild
Irish people. There, Warbeck would
have been captured by our Cousins,
the Earls of Kildare and of Desmond,
if Warbeck and his said wife had not
secretly departed. The same Perkin, 15
having escaped upon the sea, has now
come to land in our county of Cornwall
with two small ships and a boat from
Brittany with oars.

Upon hearing this, we have sent our 20
 most trusted counsellor, the Lord
 Daubeney, our chamberlain, towards
 Warbeck and any supporters, to
 prepare our subjects for the subduing
 of him. We have also sent our army 25
 with our most trusted counsellor, the
 Lord Willoughby de Broke, steward of
 our household, to Cornwall on ships,
 to capture the said Perkin, if he returns
 again to the sea. And we shall go 30
 ourselves, if the case so require, by
 the grace of God, without delay. We
 shall then subdue the said Perkin and
 all others that support him, if there
 are any. 35

Therefore, we heartily pray you to
 send to us without any long delay
 one hundred and twenty strong men
 on horseback with weapons. We do
 not require any more than that. We 40
 pray you meet with us at our manor
 of Woodstock on the 24th day of this

**present month. When you come to us,
we shall reward you with money for so
organising your men, and also supply
wages for them. We trust that this will
please you. We know you will not fail
us, given our especial trust is in you.**

Manor the 12th day of September. 50**
