Types of BTEC Higher Nationals

BTEC Higher Nationals come in two levels, both designed with input from employers, subject experts, and students to meet your learning goals and prepare you for the workplace.

Higher National Certificate (HNC)	Higher National Diploma (HND)
Usually takes one year to complete if studying full time, and two years if studying part time.	Usually takes two years to complete if studying full time, and four years if studying part time.
Equivalent to the first year of a University degree (level 4).	Equivalent to the first and second year of a University degree (level 5).
Usually a more introductory programme with a 'core' of learning essential to the subject (some sectors may have more specialist content depending on level of entry to the job market).	A more specialised programme of learning with pathways linked to occupational outcomes.
Opportunities to develop project management skills.	An increased focus on research skills.
Assessment for both years will be through a varied programme of assignments.	
Core modules credit values may vary by subject, but will not be less than 30% of the whole qualification.

Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs)

Higher Technical Qualifications, or HTQs, are technical qualifications available for students in England at higher education level.

Some BTEC Higher Nationals carry the HTQ quality mark. That means they're the same trusted qualifications but with even more employer validation.

HTQ-approved BTEC Higher Nationals meet rigorous industry standards and align with specific job roles. They're designed to give you the technical skills and knowledge employers are actively looking for.

We currently offer over 40 HTQ-approved qualifications across nine key sectors, including Business, Construction, Digital, Early Years, Engineering, Healthcare, Land, Sport and Creatives.

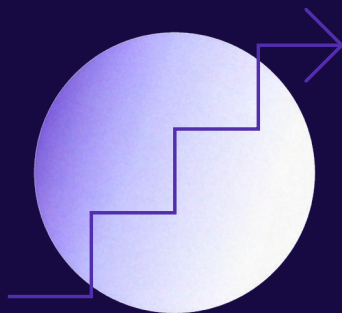
