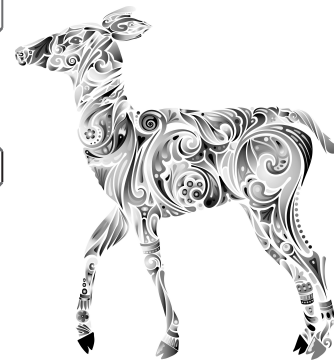

Part A Set Task Information

Peekaboo Pets is a medium-sized pet shop in Mornington selling a range of animals and animal supplies and offering pet services. In a recent inspection by the local authority it has been found to be below standard and not meeting the legislative requirements for animal welfare.

You have been asked as the pet shop supervisor to carry out an appraisal of Peekaboo Pets.

Part B Set Task Information

In preparation for the appraisal, the following documentation has been provided:

1. Peekaboo Pets pet shop – floor plan
2. Peekaboo Pets pet shop – animal species list and numbers
3. Example of Peekaboo Pets dog sale paperwork
4. Example of Peekaboo Pets 'How to Look After Your New Animal' leaflet
5. Peekaboo Pets – staff procedures document
6. Guidance from Mornington Council for pet shop owners.

This documentation can be found in the separate stimulus material booklet.

Activity 1

Write an appraisal report with recommendations for Peekaboo Pets. Using the additional information provided, you should address the following:

- legal requirements governing the sale and keeping of animals at Peekaboo Pets
- ethical issues related to animal welfare requirements
- how Peekaboo Pets meets the health and welfare needs of the animals in its care.
