Set Task Brief

Newgrange Nursery is a large nursery school that provides government funded part-time nursery education for up to 100 children. Children enter the nursery school in the term after their third birthday.

On average there are about 50 children attending any one session. The vast majority of children are of White British background. The proportion of disabled children and those who have special educational needs is above the national average.

There have been recent staff changes at Newgrange Nursery and a new head teacher was appointed six months ago. The nursery school shares accommodation and some specialist staff with the Newgrange Children's Centre.

Set Task

You must complete ALL activities within the set task.

Activity 1

The head teacher at Newgrange Nursery has just received its latest Ofsted report. The quality of the provision is good. The report states what the nursery needs to do to improve:

- Enable children to have more opportunities to develop early skills of writing as part of learning through play
- Ensure all staff encourage children's communication skills when learning through play, by giving appropriate support and guidance that makes the most of learning in all activities promoting development
- Ensure all staff have a thorough knowledge of how speech and language link to other areas of development.

Produce a report responding to Newgrange Nursery's latest Ofsted report.

You must:

- make recommendations for the nursery school
- describe the resources required
- describe the role of the early years educators and specialist staff
- justify improvements that link best practice to early years theory.

Activity 2

Teddy has just turned four years old and has been attending Newgrange Nursery for almost six months. Staff have recently been observing Teddy whilst he is playing and have noticed that his speech and language skills are not meeting the norms for a four year old.

Teddy sometimes responds incorrectly to a question. He does not reply when he is called and often speaks loudly. When the children are given instructions, Teddy copies the other children because he has not heard properly.

Teddy's mother has noticed that he always turns up the television very loud when his favourite programmes are on.

There is concern that Teddy is experiencing hearing loss. Produce a set of actions for the early years practitioner that can support Teddy. This should include the provision of specialist staff and resources.

You must:

- suggest actions that exemplify best practice
- describe the resources required, including the role of the adults caring for Teddy
- justify your actions with reference to early years theory.

Activity 3

Design **two** activities to support literacy development for **three year olds** at Newgrange Nursery. The activities must also consider the needs of children with communication delays and the contribution and support made by the early years educator. The activities should be age appropriate.

You must produce a plan for each activity, including:

- information about the resources required
- the role of early years educators, adults and others
- how the activity can meet the needs of individual children
- justifying your activity by linking best practice to early years theory.
