

Statement of Purpose

500/7867/7 – Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma in Public Services (QCF)

Despite decline in the number of people employed in the Public Sector, it is still a significant number, standing at 5.9 million at the beginning of 2012. Of those employed in the Public Sector, a significant number still work in the uniformed public services. In January 2012 those employed in the Armed forces stood at 173,020 which was 1.7% less than that required. In 2011 those employed in the Police stood at 139,000 of which 15,820 worked as Police Community Support Officers and 18,000 were Special Officers. 18,000 are employed in the Ambulance Service.

Demand for Public Services in the UK remains high, despite the increased involvement of the Private or Third sector in their delivery. Public Services, provided by Government such as law enforcement, health, defence and central and local Government remain in demand and whilst growth has slowed, will continue to have a vital role in the economic and social welfare of the nation.

The Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma in Public Services (720 GLH) is part of a larger suite of public services qualifications, in a range of sizes, which share the common purpose of helping people to become occupationally ready to take up employment in the uniformed or non-uniformed public services sector at the appropriate level. This can follow either directly after achieving the qualification, or via the stepping stone of Higher Education (HE) in university or college.

By studying a BTEC National, learners develop knowledge, understanding and skills required by the sector, including essential employability skills, and apply them in real work contexts. Learners can operate at a standard that can reasonably be expected of an 18 year old in full-time education.

Within this suite, the Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma (720 GLH) is a vocational qualification, equivalent in size to two A levels. It covers many aspects of the public Services sector and has two pathways, in Uniformed Public Services and Non-Uniformed Public Services.

The Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma in Public Services (720 GLH) has been designed to occupy two-thirds of a full-time curriculum, enabling learners to develop a significant common core of knowledge, including Government policies, leadership and teamwork, and citizenship and diversity as well as specific mandatory units related to the pathway, such as understanding discipline (Uniformed) and data interpretation (Non-Uniformed), and providing extensive opportunity to study in more depth a range of option areas of their choice, such as:

- international institutions and human rights
- discipline for the public services
- crime and its effects on society
- response to emergency incidents
- command and control
- security procedures.

The Diploma allows time in the curriculum to study other qualifications alongside it, for example A levels in Law, Psychology, Sociology, Business and Physical Education. The Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma in Public Services can be studied part time by learners in schools, colleges and other training provider organisations. Its size makes it appropriate as the core component of a Technical Baccalaureate programme, allowing time in the curriculum for the study and completion of the other mandatory components.

As the qualification was designed in close collaboration with industry, it is fully supported by the Sector Skills Council (SSC) for the sector Skills for Justice. A range of professional

organisations/employers in the sector has also confirmed their support for this Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma in Public Services. This means it is a highly respected route for those who wish to move into employment in the sector, either directly or following further study. A significant proportion of recruitment in this sector is at graduate level.

The Pearson BTEC Level 3 Diploma in Public Services also provides a well-established route into a variety of specialist Higher Education (HE) courses in this sector and beyond when taken alongside other qualifications appropriate for the desired course of study. UCAS has reviewed the qualification to assess its value for access to higher education, and has allocated UCAS points. See details published on the Pearson website here:
