Key features of BTEC L2 Sport Industry Skills

- Have a common 120 GLH unit across each.
- All four qualifications are 360GLH, and each consist of four units.
- Newly designed specification, which include delivery guidance supporting planning for teaching, learning and assessment. Additional support includes, example assignment briefs, and a supplementary teaching and learning support document.
- These qualifications will be offered through the Work Based Learning (WBL) Quality Assurance model, to support the wide range and differing needs of centres and learners.
- Designed in partnership with employers and standards mapped to a CIMSPA Professional Standard to provide the context and approach to prepare learners for their next steps, be it employment, apprenticeship or further study at Level 3.

- **BTEC Level 2 Preparation for Public Services**

Preparation for Public Services:

- Newly developed in 2020: Certificate (240 GLH) and Diploma (360 GLH) sizes.
- Designed to develop transferable workplace skills, such as good communication and the ability to work in a team, as well as units that relate directly to the skills, knowledge and behaviours expected by employers in the public services sector.
- Common Mandatory units: Public Service Skills and Support for the Community, Employment in Uniformed Public Services.
- Optional units covering health and fitness, expedition and land navigation skills, law, crime and its effects on society, cultural awareness and cyber crime.
- It is expected that learners will apply their learning to relevant employment and sector contexts during delivery, and that they will have opportunities to engage meaningfully with public service sector employers.
- It is expected that employers from the public services sector should contribute significantly to at least one mandatory unit. In some optional units we have also provided suggestions on how employers could become involved in the delivery and/or assessment of this qualification.
