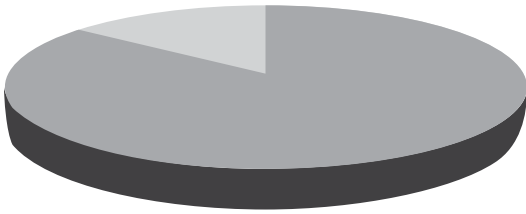

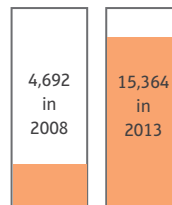
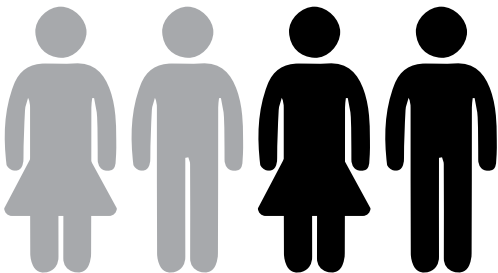
85% of BTEC students who have progressed to further study expect to derive long-term benefit from their BTEC studies.

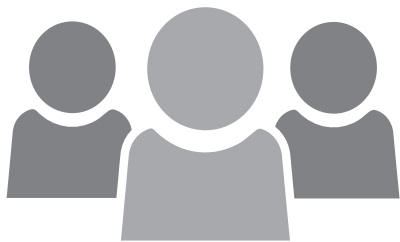
The number of students with a **mix of A levels and BTECs** accepted into UK higher education courses has grown from **4,692 in 2008** to **15,364 in 2013**.

Over 150 universities and higher education colleges in the UK that offer degree courses accept BTECs – that's 95% of UK universities and colleges.

The **acceptance rate** for 18 year olds holding BTECs increased to **81% in 2013**, the highest ever recorded level. UCAS, 2014
