





85% of BTEC students who have progressed to further study expect to derive long-term benefit from their BTEC studies.

The number of students with a mix of A levels and BTECs accepted into UK higher education courses has grown from 4,692 in 2008 to 15,364 in 2013.

Over 150 universities and higher education colleges in the UK that offer degree courses accept BTECs – that's 95% of UK universities and colleges.

The **acceptance rate** for 18 year olds holding BTECs increased to **81% in 2013**, the highest ever recorded level. UCAS, 2014
