BTEC L1/L2 Tech Award (2022) qualifications

BTECs are rigorous, future-focussed, and globally recognised qualifications that equip learners of all ages with the knowledge, skills, behaviours, and confidence to succeed in a modern, skills-based economy. One in five UK working age adults have one or more BTECs, and 6 million learners have achieved a BTEC in the last decade.

The courses are developed hand-in-glove with employers. This approach ensures that not only are the learners set up for a successful transition into the workplace, but they will go into jobs that will help satisfy the UK economy's widening skills gaps.

Included in the class of 2024 are many future healthcare professionals, engineers and construction workers, among others, who are so vital to the UK's economy.

There is increasing demand from young people for BTEC courses in UK schools. The combination of traditional academic learning with vocational and transferable skills allows young people to prepare for the possibilities that will be opened to them as the careers of the future evolve.

BTEC Tech Awards (2022)

- These are brand new qualifications, with different assessment and content structures to the previous Tech Awards.
- They have been redeveloped and designed to meet the Department for Education's latest requirements for Key Stage 4 performance tables in England.
- They are broad, high-quality Level 1 / Level 2 qualifications in non EBacc subjects, designed for Key Stage 4 learners in schools to study alongside GCSEs.
- They are the same size as a single GCSE.
- This is the first academic year that qualification results for Tech Awards (2022) have been delivered to students

Context of the 2023/24 academic year

This is the first year that qualification results for Tech Awards (2022) have been delivered to students

As part of the reform there are some key features that all Awarding Organisations had to include in their L1/L2 Technical Awards in order for them to count in performance measures. It means there is more alignment with the Technical Award qualifications, which are:

- the non-exam assessment must be set by the Awarding organisation
- the non-exam assessment must have marks and be moderated
- learners must take one or more assessments by examination, worth at least 40% of the qualification, in the series in which they certificate to meet the terminal rule

In line with Ofqual's directive for new qualifications a slightly weaker level of performance when setting grade boundaries was accepted, to reflect the fact that teachers and learners are less familiar with the assessments.

The aim of all awarding bodies has been to ensure fairness for learners by neither advantaging or disadvantaging any one group of students compared to their peers. <u>Further information can be found here.</u>

BTEC Tech Awards (2022): Key Headlines

- There are 13 qualifications available in the BTEC Tech Awards (2022).
- Health & Social Care, Sport, Enterprise, Digital Information Technology and Music are the five most popular subjects.
- This was the first academic year when qualification results were available to learners and, in line with the policy directive from Ofqual, a slightly weaker level of performance was accepted to reflect the fact that teachers and learners are less familiar with the assessments.

Introduction: Understanding BTEC Tech Award (2022) Results

Data definitions

The results publication for the BTEC Tech Awards only reports outcomes for completed qualifications. This means these results for the BTEC Tech Awards refer to those people claiming this academic year. Results from learners in all locations are included. This includes England, Wales, Northern Ireland, and all jurisdictions where we have a result for these qualifications in the academic years reported.

What is a completion? In these results, a completion refers to qualifications where a learner has been awarded a grade for the qualification, which can include U (unclassified).

What is a Pass? – These results also show figures for learners who have passed the qualification (achieved a Pass grade or above). Learners who have completed but not passed are awarded U. To pass, learners must have completed the qualification, passed the externally assessed units and achieved the required number of points on the qualification as a whole.

Rounding

Numbers in these slides are generally rounded to the nearest multiple of 100. Smaller numbers may be rounded to the nearest 10.


The 2023-24 academic year


All 13 specifications for the BTEC Tech Awards had certifications 2023/24.

Completions by region




The West Midlands has the highest number of learners completing the Tech Awards, and South East England the next highest in 2023/24.

BTEC Tech Awards (2022): 2023/24 top five sectors by volume and gender



BTEC Tech Awards: 2023/24 top five sectors for female candidates


Learners taking Health and Social Care, Enterprise and Sport are the most popular subjects with female learners.

BTEC Tech Awards achievement: grades explained

Learners who pass the BTEC Tech Awards are awarded grades using the range from Level 1 Pass (L1P), the lowest qualifying grade, up to Level 2 Distinction Star (L2D*), the highest.

Learners who have not met the standard for a Level 1 Pass are graded U (Unclassified).

NB a reminder that learners must achieve all components at Level 1 Pass or above in order to be awarded a qualification
