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<p>BTEC School or Multi-Academy Trust of the Year 2021</p>	<p>School definition</p> <p>A school is an educational institution designed to provide learning for students under the direction of teachers. This system of formal education is compulsory in the UK and students progress through a series of schools. The names for these schools vary by country but generally include primary school for young children and secondary school for teenagers who have completed primary education. An institution where higher education is taught is commonly called a university college or university, but these higher education institutions are usually not compulsory.</p> <p>Multi-Academy Trust definition</p> <p>Multi-Academy Trust (MAT) or an academy chain is academy trust that operates more than one academy school.</p> <p>Academy schools are state-funded schools in England which are directly funded by the Department for Education and independent of local authority control. The terms of the arrangements are set out in individual Academy Funding Agreements.
