 look at Tom's X rays and decide on treatment Surgeon -may need to operate on Tom's arm to straighten it or pin it in order for it to set properly Plaster technician – would apply plaster cast / dressing to Tom's arm Discharge nurse – would talk Tom through care of injured arm and prescribe pain relief Physiotherapist – would give Tom exercises to do to maintain muscle tone G.P prescribe pain killers / give after care.

Explanation may include: Cannabis produces a feeling of euphoria, known as a high, which initially improves emotional wellbeing / Not long term It may also trigger changes in perception. For instance, colours may seem brighter and more intense Emotions may be heightened There is strong evidence linking cannabis use to feelings of anxiety and panic It is also associated with lethargy, slows reaction time Loss of communication skills and a general lack of ambition There are links between cannabis use and a range of mental health problems Is linked to cancers / lung cancer Can be used for pain relief Is thought to be addictive or similar
