4 Legislation (including the Equality Act (2010) and the Disability Discrimination Acts of 1995 and 2005) seeks to protect and promote the individual rights and responsibilities of people who have physical or learning disabilities.

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(b) Explain **one** way that the rights of people with **learning** disabilities are promoted.

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(c) Some people with disabilities have the right to benefits, such as a Disability Living Allowance and a Carer's Allowance.

Describe the advantages of providing benefits for someone with a disability.

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7 (a) Obesity is a serious medical issue facing service users **and** service providers.

(i) Explain how people who have obesity can be treated with dignity by service providers in the **health** sector.

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(ii) Explain **one** other issue, apart from dignity, which service providers should consider when treating people with obesity.

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(b) It has been suggested that individuals who use services in the four sectors, such as people with long-term medical conditions, people who need social care or people who need to gain qualifications, have responsibilities as well as rights.

Evaluate reasons why individuals have responsibilities when **using** services in the four sectors.
