4(b)	<p>Explanations could include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An advantage of travelling by train is that it is cheaper than travelling by air. • Travelling by train takes less time than travelling by train. • A disadvantage of travelling by train is that the actual journey takes longer and is more tiring • An advantage of travelling by air is that it is more relaxing because there is less time on the actual journey most time is spent waiting at the terminal building. • A disadvantage of travelling by air is the inconvenient location of the airport so time is wasted getting to the airport. <p>It takes 4 hours to travel their by train and 6 hours to travel to Manchester by air. This is a disadvantage because Mr Hardwick would have to get up earlier and get back later. It might also be more tiring as he is travelling for longer.</p>

3	5-6	A fully developed response. For the top of the level advantages and disadvantages should be discussed for both forms of transport.

5	<p>Up to 3 marks for description of each source.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Timetable – The timetable would show the different stops along the way (1) Mr Hardwick would know which bus to get (1) Mr Hardwick would know what time the buses run to the tower of London (1) • Map – Map would show location of different visitor attractions (1) map would let him plan his route (1) show underground stations (1) • Internet - Mr Hardwick could look up opening times (1) and prices (1) he would be better informed about the attractions that London has to offer. (1) • Leaflet or brochure – Mr Hardwick could look up opening times (1) and prices (1) opening times and facilities available, information on history what to see or do. (1) 	(6)

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
