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Marking The Script

The first thing to note here is a comment by the assessor at the bottom of the completed form, stating the learner should lose a mark for not using the past tense. However, The learner only has to use appropriate tenses to complete the task. They don't have to use past, present and future. Just whatever tense makes sense. So, in this example, although past tense could be used to explain why they like the store, it isn't essential. Assessors should just mark the tenses used.

In terms of marking, the learner has made 2 spelling errors, so they would drop that mark. They would, however, receive all the other marks.

This learner would achieve six out of seven marks.

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
