The GCSE hurdle...

Undoubtedly, you would have heard the recent announcement made by the Rt Hon Jim Knight, the Minister of State for Schools and Learners, that the proposed hurdle for Functional Skills within GCSE English, Mathematics and ICT for 2010 is to be removed. This means that students will no longer have to pass Level 2 Functional Skills in order to achieve a grade C or above for these core GCSE subjects.

Whilst the minister has written to say that, "we accept that we should not make a link between the functional skills assessments and the GCSE" they are keen that students continue with Functional Skills assessments, "so that they can demonstrate success in learning these vital skills."

With information pending on how incentives may be offered for centres offering Functional Skills, we are continuing to support centres with implementation for the duration of the pilot and as it moves on to its live phase in 2010.

Onscreen – our new Functional Skills pilot goes 21st century

Registration for our new onscreen pilot is live. Designed with flexibility for centres and learners, it offers onscreen assessment and internally assessed papers, facilitating a faster turnaround of results and moving further towards assessment 'on demand'. Registration is now open and is FREE to centres that fulfil the criteria. First assessment is planned to take place in June. This onscreen pilot will operate alongside the mainstream Functional Skills pilot, and will be available to a limited number of centres this year.

To become an onscreen pilot centre you need to fulfil the following criteria:

- each learner in the Pilot Cohort must be taking Level 1 or Level 2 Adult Literacy or Numeracy qualifications with Edexcel.
- pilot learners can be 19+ years old, and in full or part time education.

OR

- aged 16-19 and in part-time education only.

Recognising attainment - Exceptional awards at Level 1

We are pleased to announce that for the period of the pilot, we are now able to award a pass at Level 1 for candidates that fall below the threshold for a pass on a Level 2 paper.

These awards will be made where a candidate's performance falls just below the pass boundary but still provides adequate coverage of the standards required for Level 1.

Are you eligible to join this September?

Centre eligibility from September has now been updated and centres wishing to join the pilot in the third year will have to meet one or more of the following criteria:

- existing centres from the first and second year of the pilot
- centres registering learners for the Diploma from September 2009
- centres that will be offering the Advanced Diploma in September 2010
- centres participating in the Foundation Learning Tier (FLT) pilot
- a further education college or training provider that can offer apprenticeship learners
- centre/provider with contracts offering learning in the custodial sector or probation service
- centre/provider of adult education

QCA – Functional Skills 'lessons learnt'

QCA has produced a comprehensive case study brochure based on their recent Functional Skills evaluation events that were held last month. The brochure contains ten case studies focusing on a mixture of schools and colleges who are using different methods of integration to prepare staff and students for Functional Skills.

It is a useful document that provides a personalised view of centre experiences of the Functional Skills pilot, as well as providing words of advice for new centres based on the lessons they themselves have learned. What Functional Skills means to Apprenticeships

In 2010 Functional Skills will replace Key Skills within the new Apprenticeships.

Currently eight Sector Skills councils (SSCs) and some Standard Setting Bodies (SSBs) have amended their Apprenticeship framework to allow learners to pilot Functional Skills. This means that learners undertaking apprenticeships could choose either Functional Skills or Key Skills. Learners who take the FS route will not have to submit a portfolio but will have to undertake a speaking & listening and writing assessment.

The organisations who have amended apprenticeships currently are:

- Construction Skills - construction
- ICS (an SSB) - customer service
- SEMTA - engineering
- SkillsActive - sporting excellence
- Skills for Health - health and social care, dental assistants, pharmacy
- Skillsmart Retail - retail CfA (an SSB) - business and administration
- Skills for Logistics - carry and deliver goods, warehouse and storage
- E-Skills - IT and telecoms professionals, IT user
- TDA (SSB)- supporting teaching and learning in schools
- Government skills
