






How many marks would you award?

How many marks would you award?

- The first issue here is the lack of annotations that were completed by the assessor. This make life more difficult for Internal Verifiers and Standards Verifiers. They are meant to check the marking, but in this case, they would need to rewrite the marking as there are insufficient annotations.
- This learner would score six marks out of a possible nine for this answer.
- For composition they scored
 - three out of three for the content the ticks highlight the content.
 - one out of two for layout no subject in the email header.
 - one mark out of one for appropriate language.
- For SPaG, the learner scored one out of three marks.
 - They got zero marks for punctuation and zero marks for spelling.
