Foot ball by Malcolm Farley

This was made in 1915 with pencil and a panel folding screen. I like how An Jung-Sik use multiple panels which stands out to me more than one screen would. In my final piece I use multiple panels. An jung-SIK's pen name was Sunjeon (삼전) he lived at the very end of the Joseon period. He was a key part to pursue the transition that started from the true view last of Jeong Seon (1666-1821) towards the nowadays way of holding the fine arts in both South and North Korea. An jung-SIK was born in Seoul. He started painting with Anwon Jeong Seung-eop.

The man's face is obscured by a hovering green apple.

My favorite painting by René Magritte is 'La grande guerre' (otherwise known as 'The great war'). I love this painting because of how simple it looks but it has a deeper meaning behind it.
