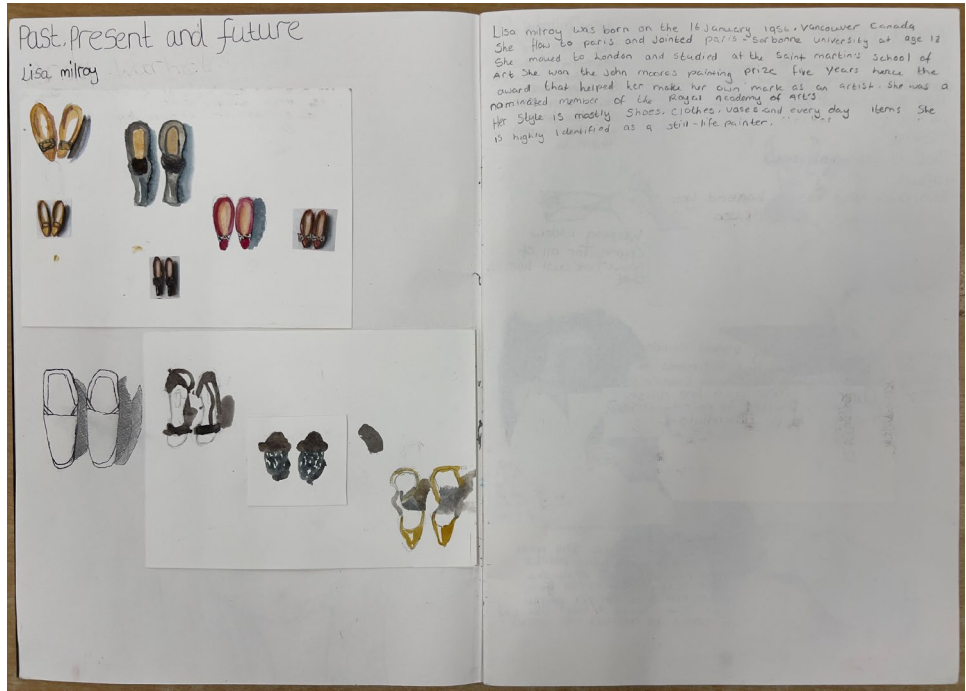
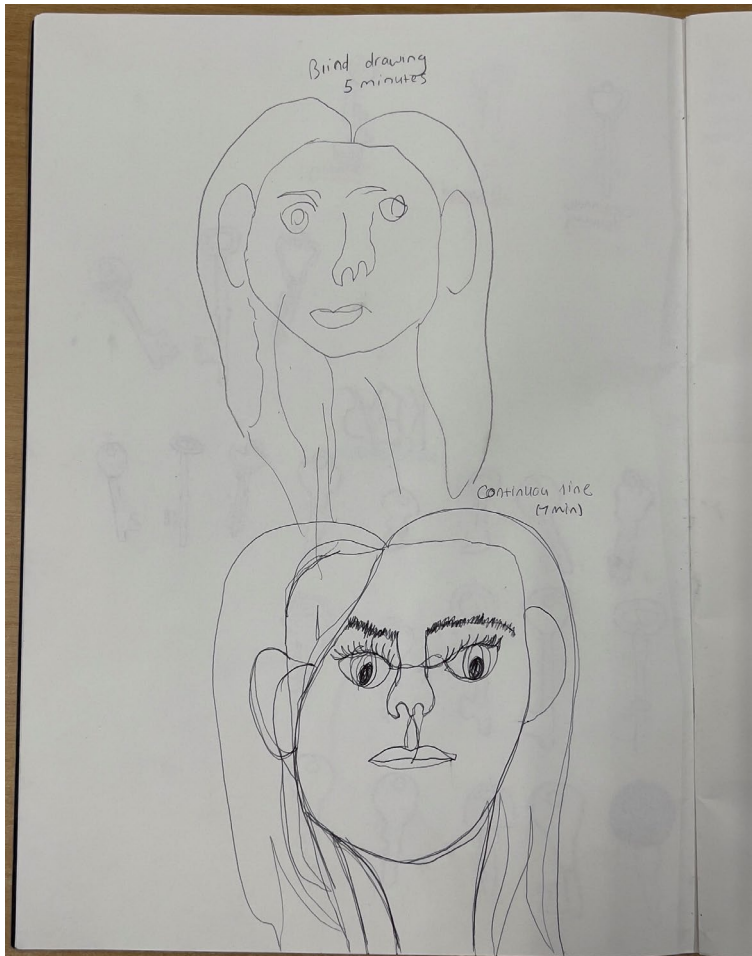
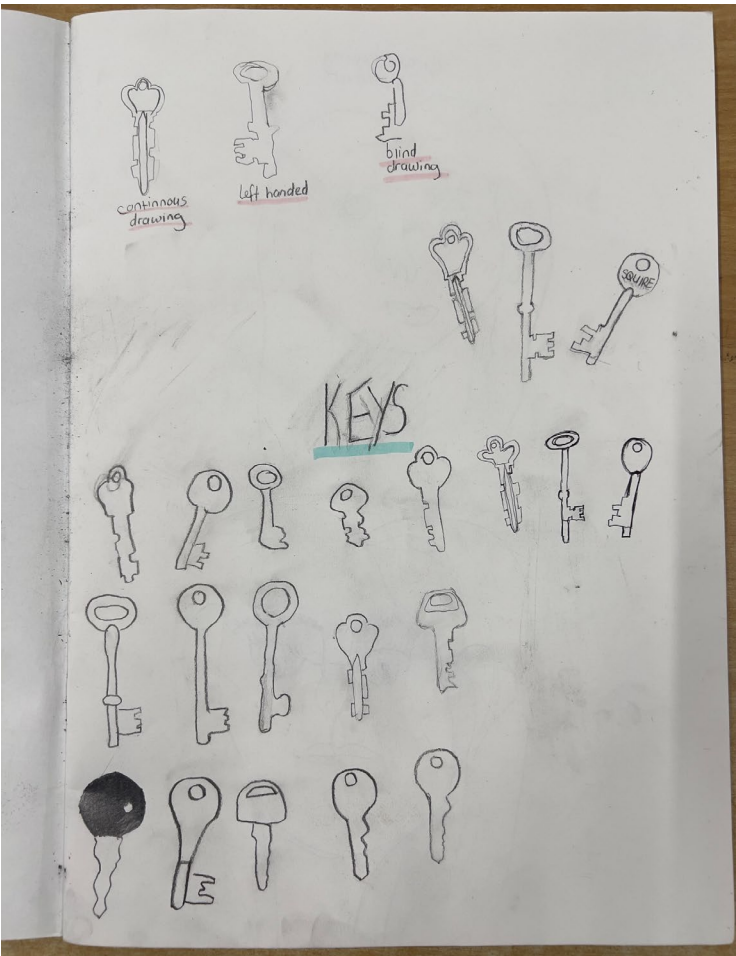

 Margaret mee was born on the 22nd May 1909, Chesham. She was a British botanical artist who specialised in plants from the Brazilian Amazon basin. From 1928 she worked at the London Botanic Garden. She studied at the London School of Art in 1922. She moved to Brazil with her second husband, Cyril Mee, when she died in 1972. She lived in London, England. She was a member of the Royal Society of Botanical Artists and the Royal Society. She died on 30 September 1972, Seagrave.
