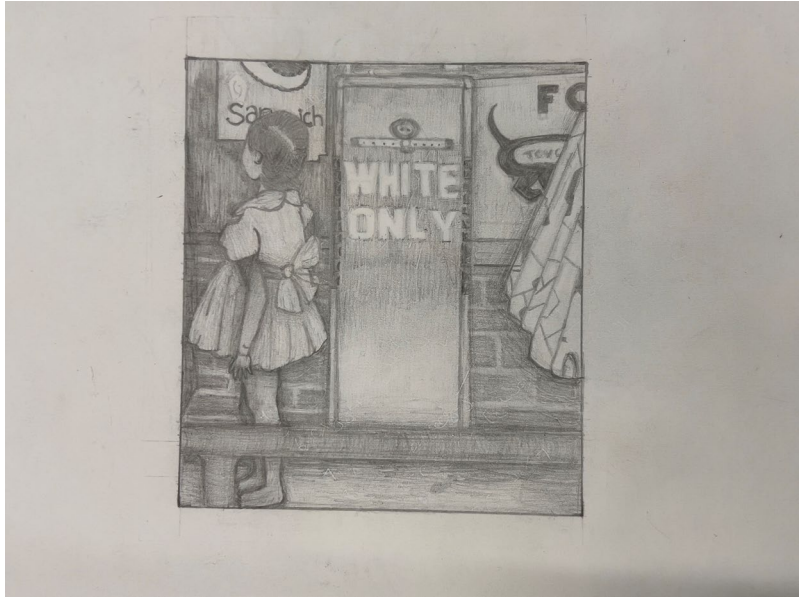
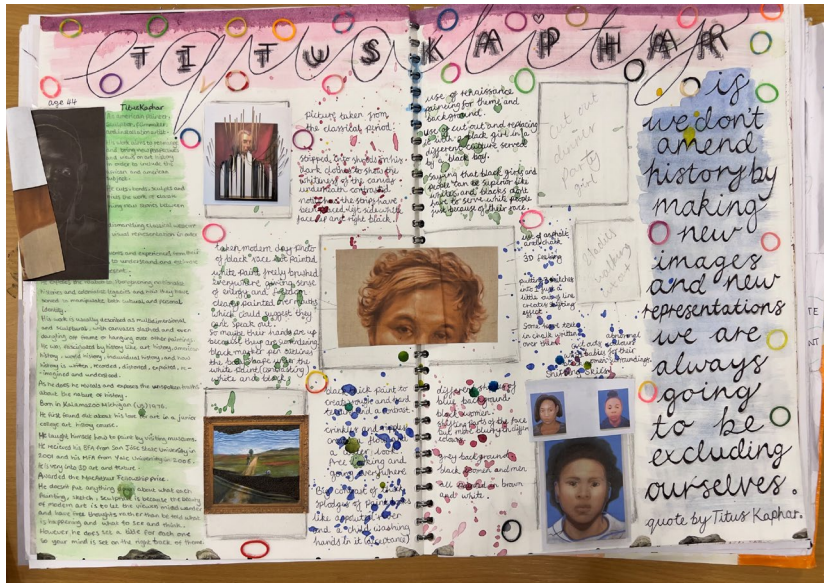
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NELSON MANDELA **NELSON MANDELA**

Rolihlahla Mandela was born into the Madiba clan in the village of Mvezo in the Eastern Cape on July 18, 1918.

That same year he met and married Evelyn Ntoko Mase. In 1952 in Johannesburg with a fellow ANC leader Oliver Tambo, Mandela established South Africa's first Black law practice specialising in cases resulting from the post 1948 Apartheid legislation.

I have walked that long road to freedom. I have tried not to falter. I have made mistakes along the way. But I have discovered the secret that after climbing a great hill, one only finds that there are many more hills to climb. I have taken a moment here to rest, to steal a view of the glorious vista that surrounds me, to look back on the distance I have come. But I can only rest for a moment, for with freedom comes responsibilities, and I dare not linger, for my long walk is not ended.

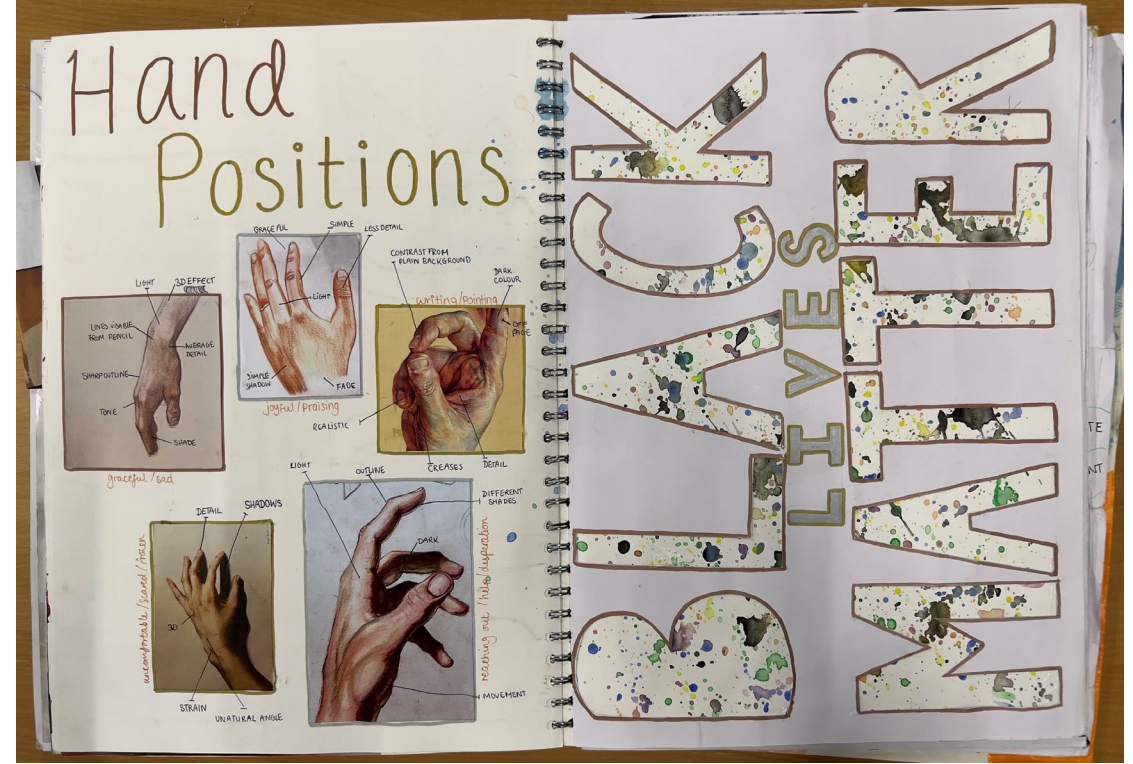
Hearing the elder stories of his ancestors' valour during the wars of resistance he dreamed of also making his own contribution to the freedom struggle of his people.

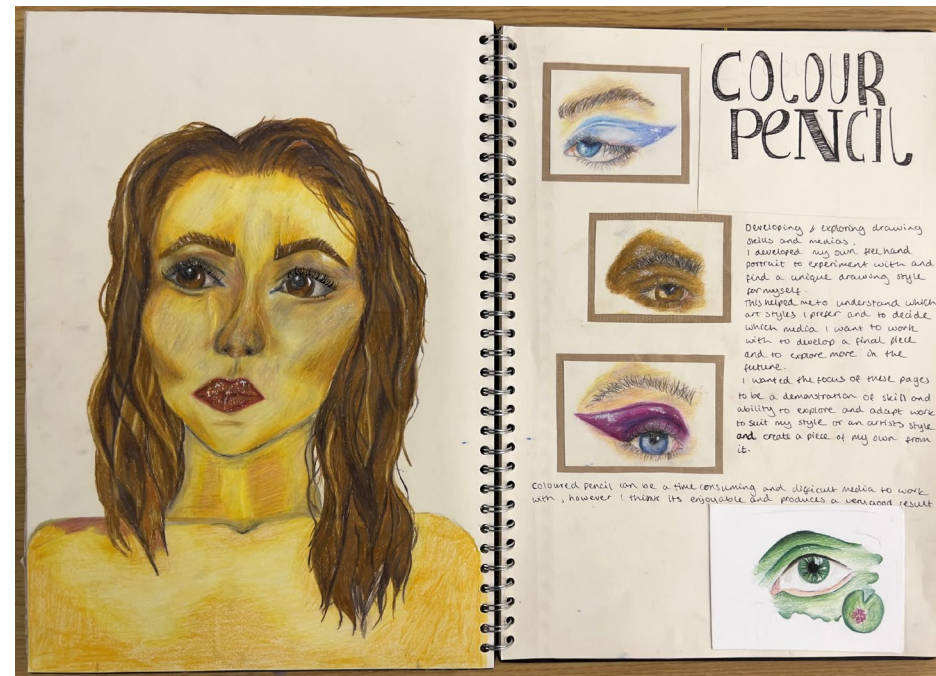
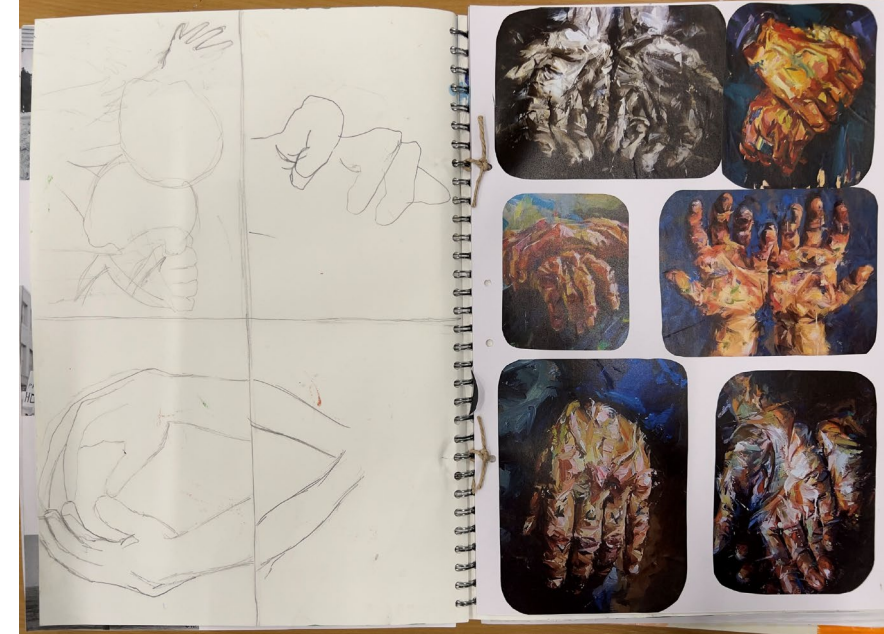
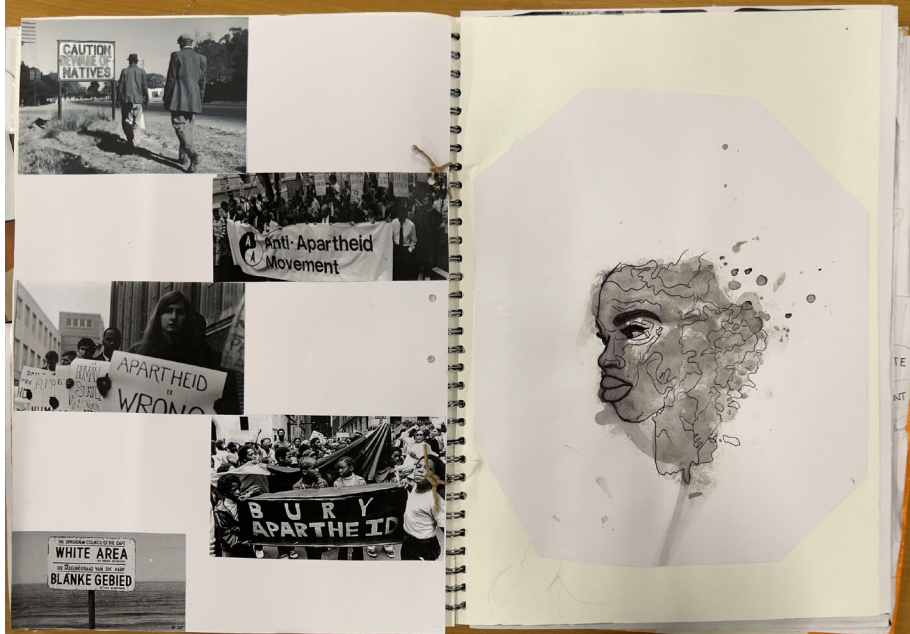

In the same year, Mandela played an important role in launching a campaign of defiance against South Africa's past laws put in for Black and white people. This was to restrict the Black to the achievement to be a lawyer. He studied law at college and university and after passed the qualification exam to become a lawyer. He then joined ANC, a black liberation group.

He was imprisoned multiple times for activism and breaking the rules and was sentenced to life imprisonment and narrowly escaped the death penalty. He won South Africa's first election in 1994 by universal suffrage and shortly after was assassinated and succeeded in 1999.

Paul Wright is a British painter, he is best known for his portraits, visible brush strokes, large scale works and streaks of unblended colour. His subjects also include still lifes and interior scenes.

After graduation, he started experimenting with works creating using larger brushes. The new technique greatly differed from the techniques he had been taught during his undergraduate studies.

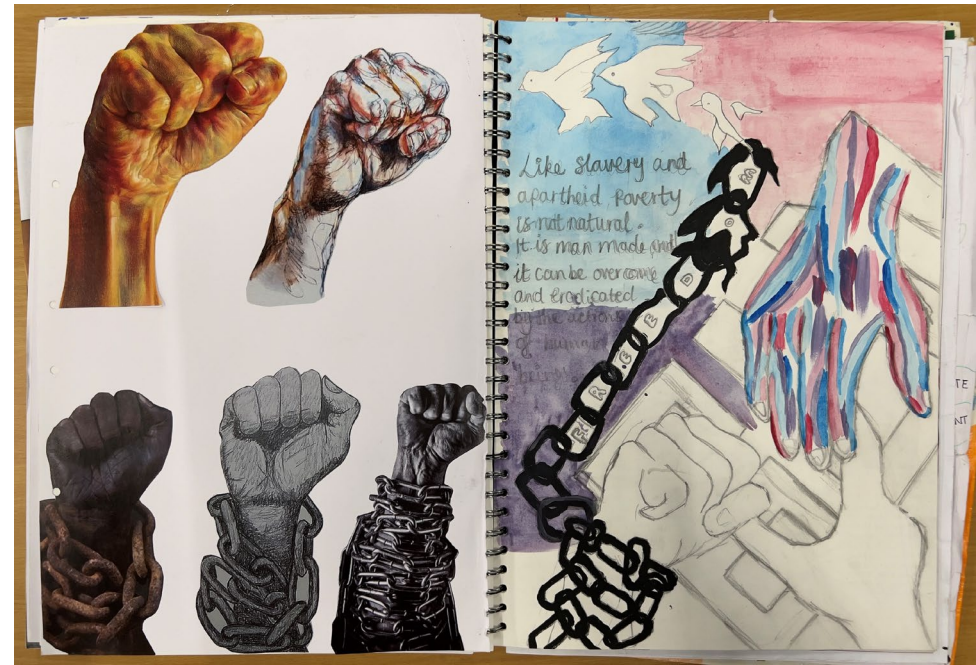
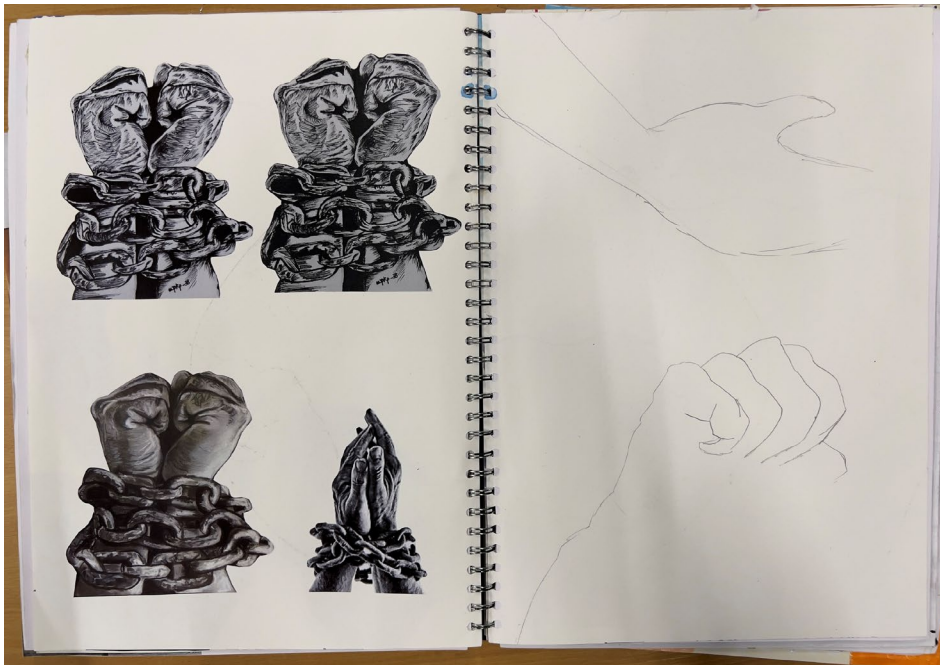
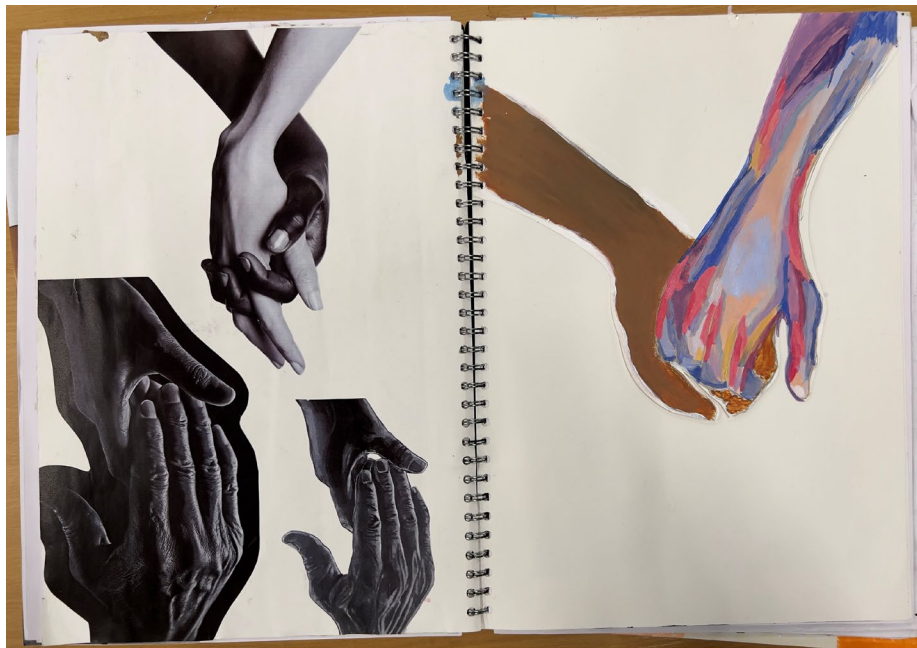


His paintings are large, expensive, realised with thick, exuberant brushstrokes, rich palette, and feature a fusion of abstraction and representation.

He was nominated for the prestigious BP portrait award in 2014.

His works are featured in many collections such as Standard Chartered Bank Prudential, Texas State University, Accenture and Leicestershire Health Authority.

Shepard

Frank Shepard Fairey was born on the 15th of February in 1970. He is an American contemporary street artist, graphic designer, activist, illustrator and founder of OBEY clothing who emerged from the skateboarding scene.

He was first recognised for his Andre the Giant has a posse (OBEY) sticker campaign while attending the Rhode Island School of design (RSID).

He was then noticed from around the world for his Barack Obama 'Hope' poster during the US presidential election in 2008.

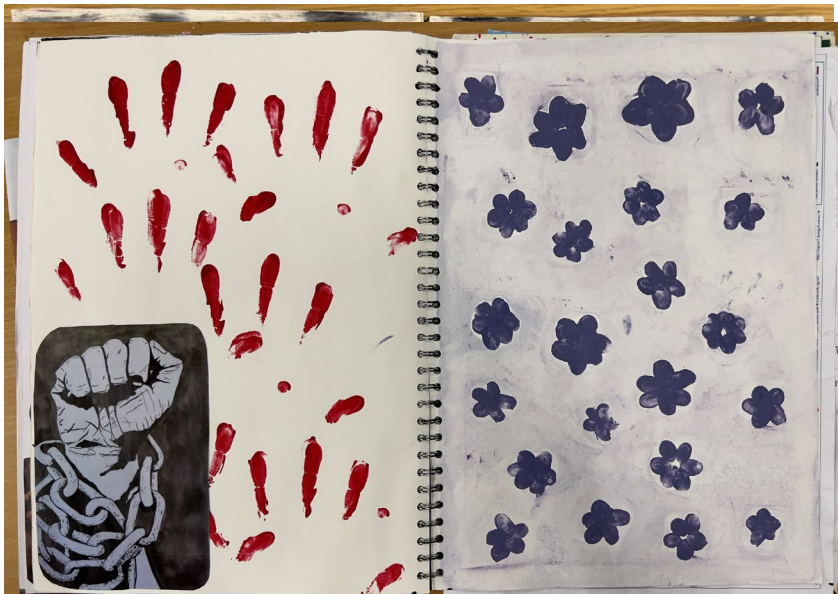
The Institute of Contemporary art, Boston has described him as one of the best known and influential street artists.
