Top Exam tips



Be mindful of time

Make sure you allocate your timing across the different sections of the exam paper, giving adequate time for the longer responses at the end of each paper.



Use the question to guide your answer

The question will state what you need to include in your answer. Longer questions give links to the specification topics.



Focus on key words

Answers should refer directly to all the key words in the question.



Go beyond the source

In 6-mark source questions, repeating the source will not gain any marks so use the source as a springboard to explore Citizenship issues, in relation to the question. Focus on applying your knowledge and understanding.



Answer the question

Focus on the question that is set and ensure all points link to the question, as off-topic material will not be credited.



Develop points

When asked to 'explain', 'analyse' or 'discuss arguments', you should add development to points, adding additional detail, evidence or examples to show understanding.



Attempt all questions

Adopt a have-a-go attitude to all questions – you cannot get any marks if you don't write anything.



Be specific

Don't assume the examiner knows what you mean - try to be as specific as possible in your response. Give specific details, reasons and examples where possible.



Read all options carefully in MCQs

In multiple-choice questions, read all options carefully before selecting your answer.



Consider different views

Within extended answer questions, make sure you refer to competing points of view – even if you disagree with them before forming a conclusion.

And remember to show what you know!

There are no trick questions – the examiner is always looking to positively mark based on what you know.
