Our mission is to create a pathway for young people, from primary school through further education, to enhance their speaking and communication skills. We have trained over 181,000 KS3 students in over 500 schools, which is almost 1 in 5 schools in the UK; many of these schools using the skills we develop to support their GCSE Spoken Language assessment.

We believe that communication skills can always be refined and improved, for this reason we have worked with adults of all abilities in over 1000 different charities and educational institutions to ensure that adults continue to develop their public speaking skills.

From this work we have developed with Pearson a selection of workshops. Whether a KS4 student preparing for a Spoken Language assessment, a teacher wanting to engage a class or a school wanting to encourage oracy in the classroom, our workshops are designed to build confidence – enabling people from all backgrounds to speak with clarity, conviction and impact.

Student Workshops

Speakers Trust Spoken Language training day

Speakers Trust will deliver a highly interactive programme specifically designed for the Edexcel Spoken Language assessment. The programme begins with student resources, which will assist them in choosing their topic and begin to identify areas of public speaking that they love and loathe.

Following student preparation, an expert Speakers Trust public speaking trainer will deliver one full school day of Spoken Language training. This fun, interactive day of training will cover all aspects of Spoken Language and the students will learn quickly and easily to express their thoughts and answer questions on their topic in a structured and compelling way. At the conclusion of the workshop each participant will have the opportunity to practice their speech and receive feedback from both the trainer and their peers, promoting active listening from both audience and speaker. To give the students the best possible chance in their assessment we will then provide follow up material for students, teachers and guardians. These resources will not only encourage students to continue to practise their speech and implement the feedback they have received but resources will also support guardians and teachers to fully prepare students for their assessment.

Following the workshop the teacher, who will be fully equipped with follow up resources, will conduct the Spoken Language assessment.

Coaching and support on assessment day

Once students have completed one day of training and developed a speech we can offer further support to schools. On the day of the assessment our expert trainers will come in to school and provide pre assessment coaching. Having previously worked with the students trainers will deliver personalised coaching in a session designed specifically to meet the needs of those students. Following 2 hours of coaching, trainers will use their expert facilitation skills, to facilitate the assessment itself. This gives the staff the opportunity to focus on assessing alone whilst providing the students with the support and advice needed for them to excel in their Spoken Language assessment.

Teacher Workshops

Here at Speakers Trust, we recognise that teaching is a hugely rewarding and important profession, but similarly one of the toughest jobs out there.
