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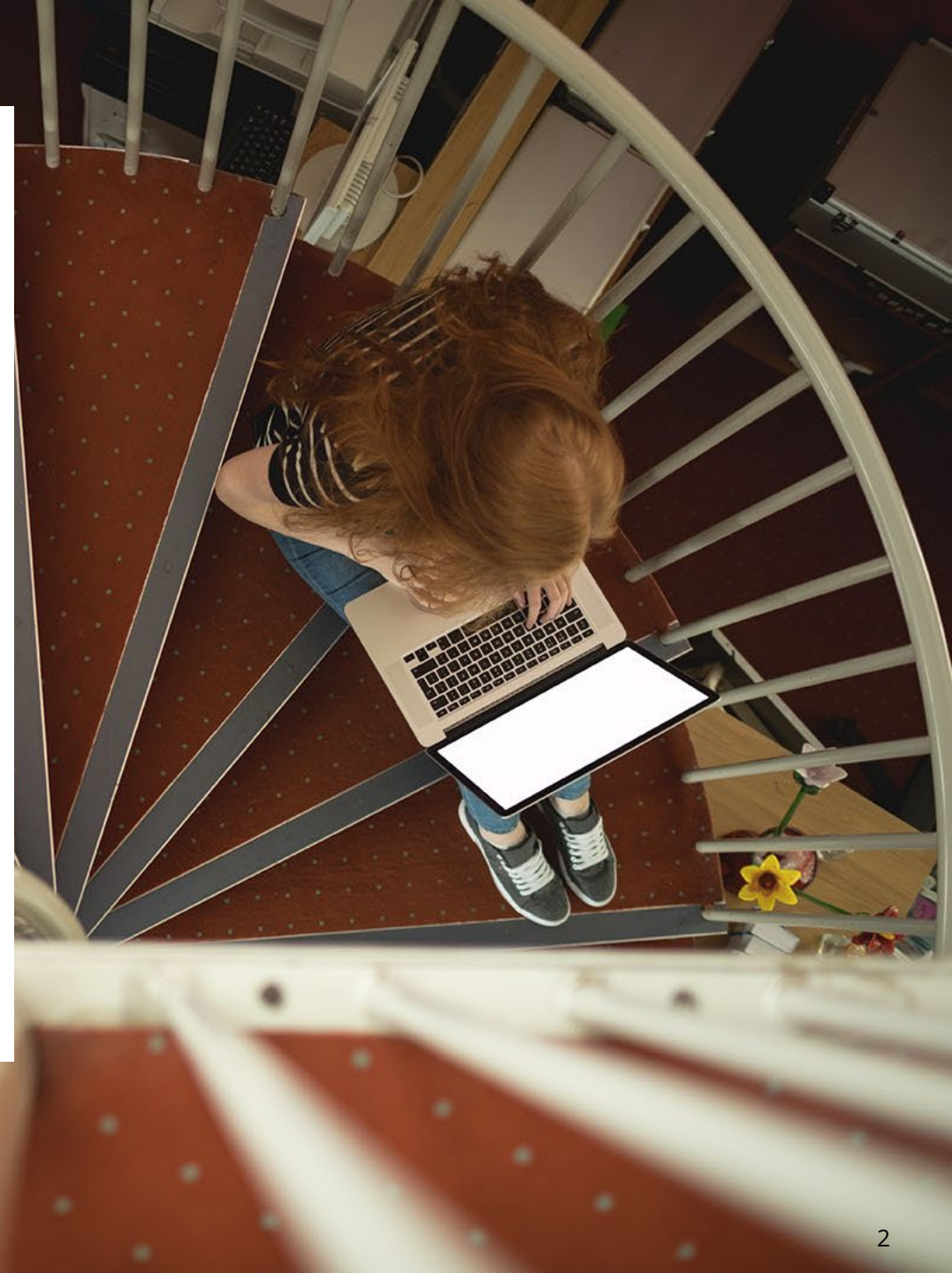

Key deadlines to work to:

- 29 September 2022: Reviews of Marking and moderation
- 4 October 2022: entry deadline for the November 2022 exam series for 1EN0/1EN2 for students who wish to resit
- 16 December 2022: end date for downloading students' scripts from the June 2022 exam series using the free access to scripts service

Using post-results services: reminders

- ATS: you need the 'Exam Viewer' profile ticked on Edexcel Online. Exams officers give teachers access to Exam Viewer.
- You access student scripts via Edexcel Online, not via ResultsPlus
- ResultsPlus: you need 'resultsplus' ticked on your Edexcel Online profile. Your exams officer amends your profile if it is not ticked.
- How to download [student results from ResultsPlus](#).
- How to get [examiner reports from ResultsPlus](#) (easier from the qualification page).

November 2022 exam series for 1EN0 & 1EN2

Resit rules

Entry deadline: 4 October 2022

Eligibility: any student who was aged at least 16 on 31 August 2022

SLE: enter grades on Edexcel Online by 5.11.22 (or carry forward from a previous series using the 'T' entry option); no audio-visual recordings required

Exam format for 1EN0: we have made some minor amendments to the format to improve the experience for students. See the [issue 3 sample assessment materials](#) for details.

Exam dates 1EN0/1EN2:

31 October 2022, am: 1EN0 01 & 1EN2 01

2 November 2022, am: 1EN0 02 & 1EN2 02

Set up for 'back to usual' delivery in June 2023

No adjustments (AI/optionality) for the June 2023 exam series are anticipated. However, all awarding organisations are awaiting confirmation of this from Ofqual and the DfE.

1EN0/1EN2

- Both specifications now include a list of the transactional writing text types that will be set in exams
- There is additional guidance on the expected form of the text types for 1EN0 and 1EN2
- 1EN0: article, letter, review, text for a speech, section for a guide/textbook/leaflet/booklet.
- 1EN2: article, blog, formal email, letter, report, review, text for a speech, section for guide/textbook/leaflet/booklet
- 1EN0: [minor format changes to the question papers](#)

1ET0

- Assessed as in the specification.
- Students (including resit students) are assessed on 4 texts (Shakespeare, post-1914 literature, 19th-century novel and poetry since 1789)
- Paper 2 returns to 2 hours and 15 minutes

SLE: audio-visual samples and submitting on the LWT for June 2023

- A sample of audio-visual recordings of SLE assessments **is required**
- For cohorts of 30 students or more: 10 distinctions, 10 merits and 10 passes from across teaching groups. **Centres select their own sample.**
- Full details are in the 1EN0/1EN2 specifications and in the [administrative support guide](#).
- Submit SLE grades on Edexcel Online by 15 May 2023 for the June 2023 exam series.
- Submit audio-visual recordings on the Learner Work Transfer (LWT) portal by 15 May 2023 for the June 2023 exam series.

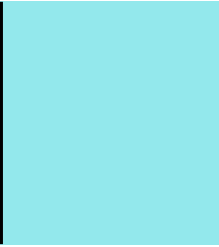
The National Tutoring Programme moves to FS L2
