## Booster 2: Future tense

### Key learning

The tense of a verb tells you when the action happened. For example:

Something happened in the **past**.

Something is happening or happens in the **present**.

Something is going to happen in the **future**.

Before you start writing, think, is this event happening now, has it already happened or will it happen in the future? If you are writing in the future, you are writing about something that has not yet happened or does not yet exist.

### Worked example:

Select the correct verb to complete the following sentences in the future tense.

I <b>will go</b> shopping next week.	went	will go	goes
Scott _____ to the station tomorrow.	walk	walked	will walk
Sam _____ her aunt next Sunday.	will visit	visited	visits
They _____ to the airport together.	travel	will travel	travelling

### Answers:

Scott **will walk** to the station tomorrow.

Sam **will visit** her aunt next Sunday.

They **will travel** to the airport together.

All these actions are happening in the future. We know this because of certain clue words such as, 'tomorrow' or 'next Sunday'.

### Your turn:

Now write **four** to **six** sentences about your life in the future. You could include:

- where you are going to live
- your ideal job
- where you are going to go on holiday
- if you are going to own any pets.
