## Booster 4: Understanding the meaning of questions

### Key learning

When selecting appropriate information to answer questions you must understand what the question is asking. There are two steps you should follow.

Step 1: Read the question carefully.

Step 2: Make sure you understand any unfamiliar words in the question.

### Worked example:

Read the following text carefully.

There are two parts to the driving test:

1. a practical exam
2. a theory exam.

The first involves:

- driving the car on a public road
- following the instructions of the driving examiner.

The second involves:

- a multiple-choice test of 50 questions
- a video question and answer test.

What are the **two** parts of the theory exam?

Before you answer the question, remember the two steps described above.

To answer this question, you need to be confident that you understand the meaning of the word 'theory'.

There are two ways you can find out the meaning of a word:

- look it up
- work it out from the way it is used in the text.

Here the way the word is used in the text makes its meaning clear. The writer describes the practical exam as the first part of the test, and the theory exam as the second.
