Booster 6: Selecting specific information

Key learning

Some questions will ask you to select a specific type of information for your answer. To do this you need to follow two steps.

Step 1: Read the question carefully. Look for key words to help you understand the type of information you should select.

Step 2: Read the text carefully. Search for key words in the text to make sure you identify the information the question refers to.

Remember to look for the key words in the question and look for the information in the text which is related to them.

Worked example:

Read the following text carefully.

Many young people today feel as if they have lost their connection to nature. Forest School offers the opportunity for students to take part in a week of outdoor activities in a woodland setting.

Activities on offer to students include:

- shelter building
- fire building
- nature treks.

What opportunity is offered to students? Tick **one** box only.

Answer:

A To take part in a week of activities in a woodland setting.

Step 1: Read the question carefully. The key word in this question is **opportunity**.

Step 2: Read the text carefully. The writer refers to the '**opportunity** for students to take part in a week of outdoor activities in a woodland setting'.
