- 1870s and 1880s: Farming equipment was manufactured in the eastern states.
- 1874: Barbed wire was invented.
- By 1890, six railroads crossed the USA from east to west.

6 (a) Describe the effects of the discovery of gold in California in 1848 on the settlement of the American West. (9)

*(b) 'The work of Joseph McCoy was the most important factor in the development of the cattle industry'. Do you agree? Explain your answer. (16)

You may use the following in your answer and any other information of your own.

- Joseph McCoy made Abilene a base for trading cattle.
- 1872: John Iliff supplied beef to Indian reservations.
- 1880s: Portable wind pumps were used on the Great Plains.
