(b) **Study Interpretations 1 and 2.**

They give different views about Nazi methods of controlling the German people in the years 1933–39.

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Explain your answer, using details from **both** interpretations.

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Q3b: What is the main difference between the views?

Interpretation 1 was mainly focusing on how Hitler spread his words and ideas in a ~~subtly~~ ^{subtly} way. However, for example, the highlighted quotation "Radio broadcasts created an emotional tone." this is using propaganda to get people to agree with Hitler and the Nazis. However, Interpretation 2 focused on mainly violence and the consequences if anybody talked bad upon Hitler and the Nazis. "109,000 people imprisoned without trial" this is using interrogation and violence through law to get people to like Hitler and the Nazis.



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You are expected to support the overall difference in view with details from both interpretations.

What makes a good answer?

The examiner is looking for:

- identify a difference in the overall views being offered in the interpretations.
- answer based on the interpretation and not the provenance
- support your identified difference with detail from the interpretations.



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- use both interpretations.
 - Connectives such as '*however*' '*whereas*' '*in contrast*' can help you convey the difference.
 - make sure you are showing the difference in views about the enquiry and not simply the difference in individual details.
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
