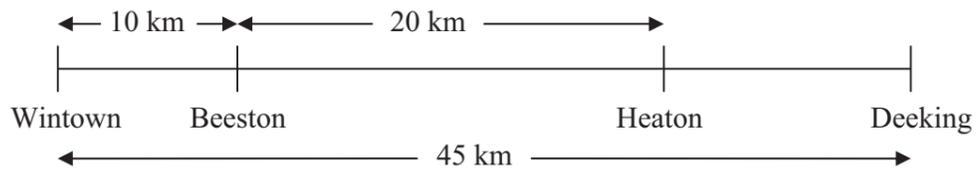

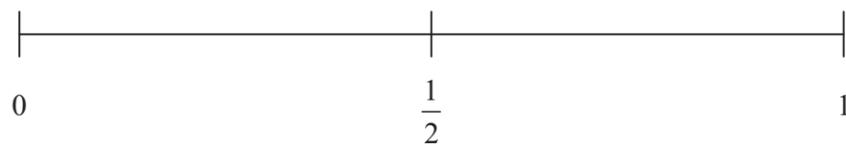

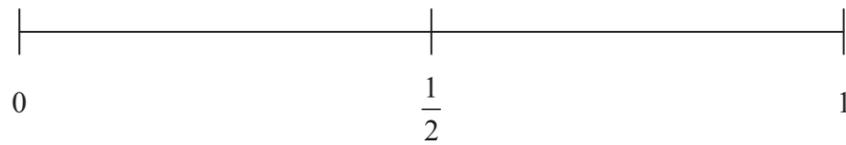

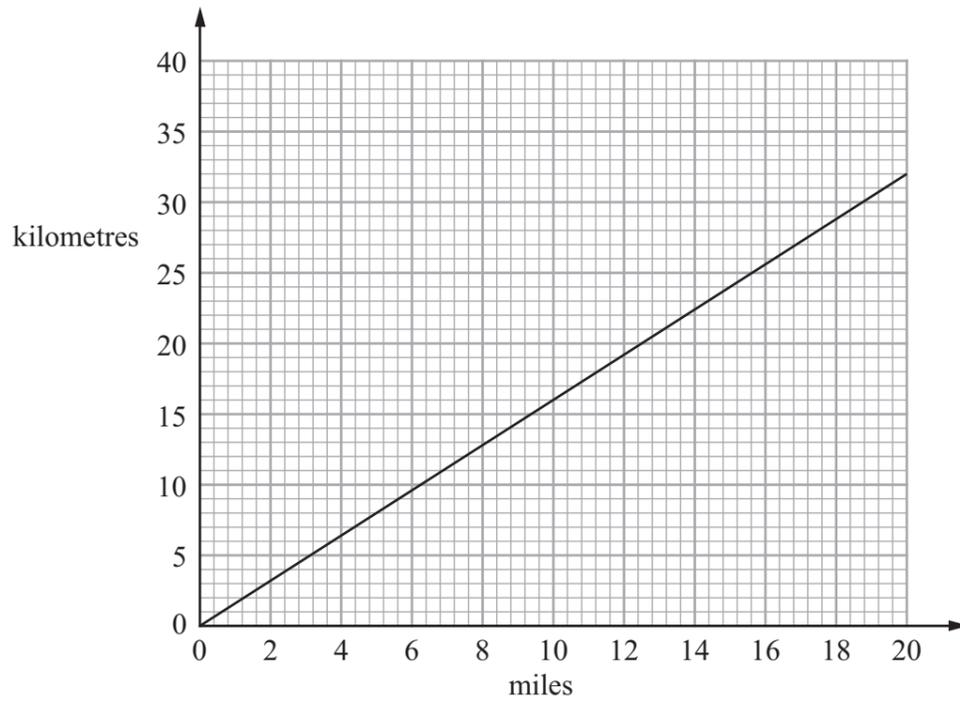

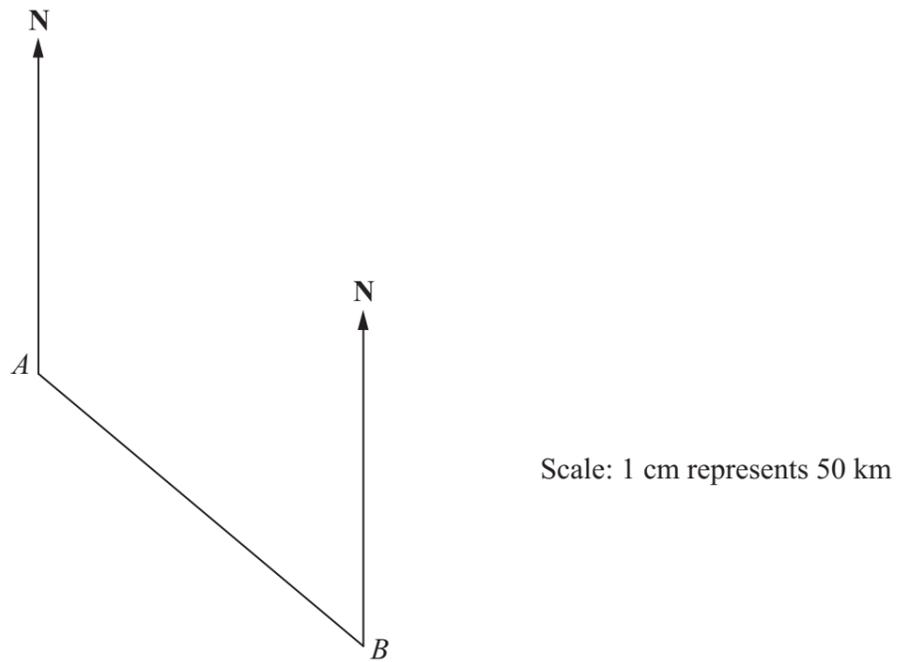

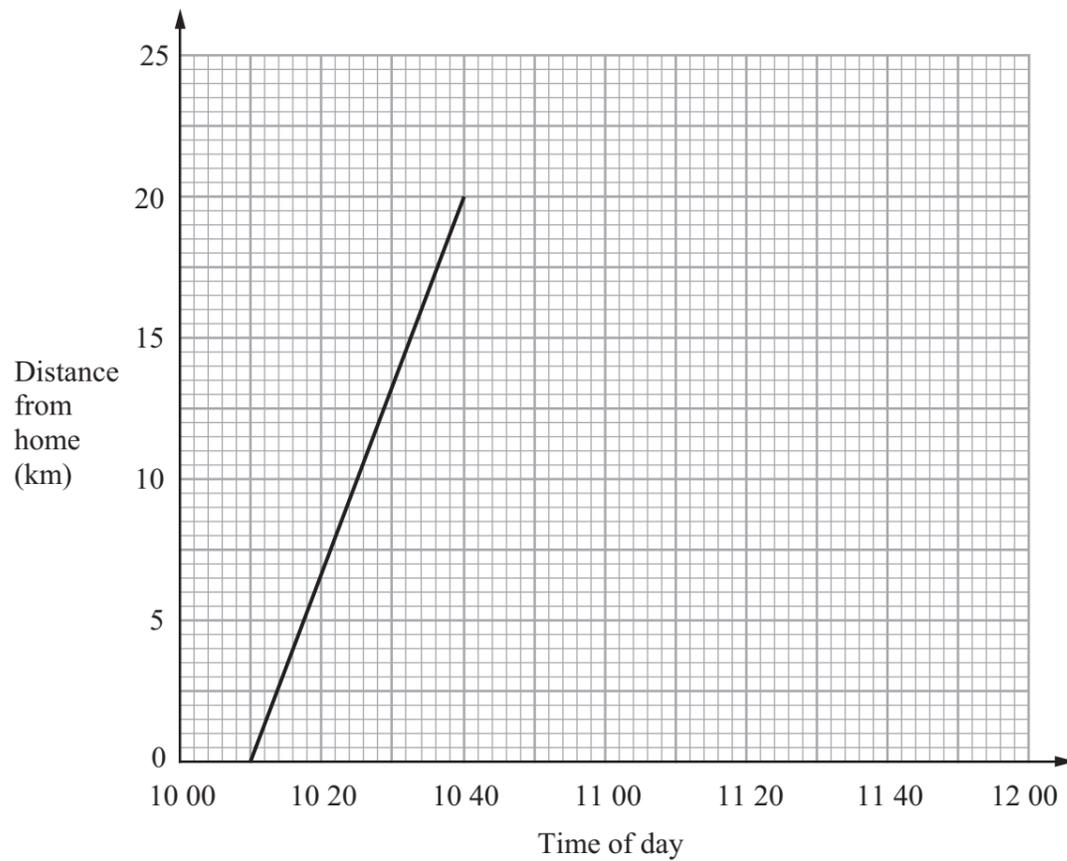

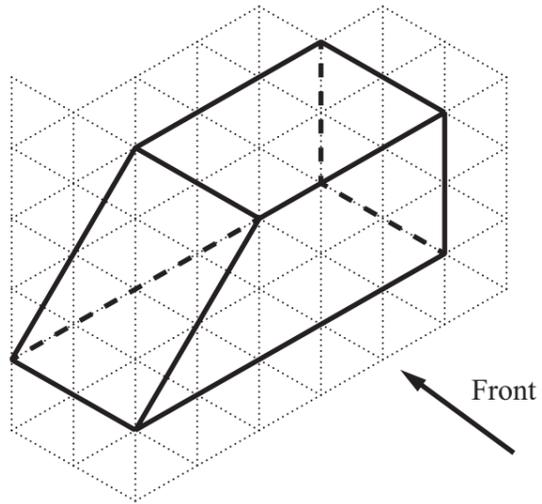

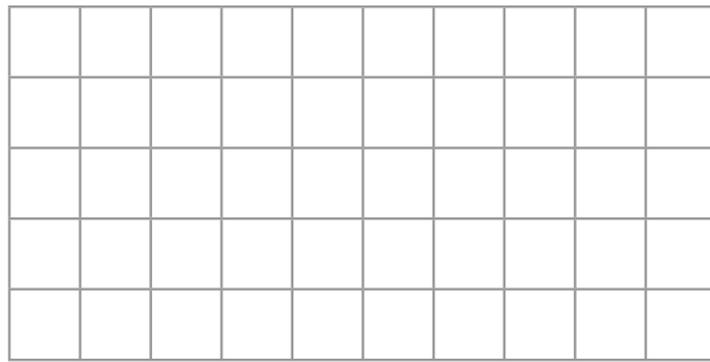

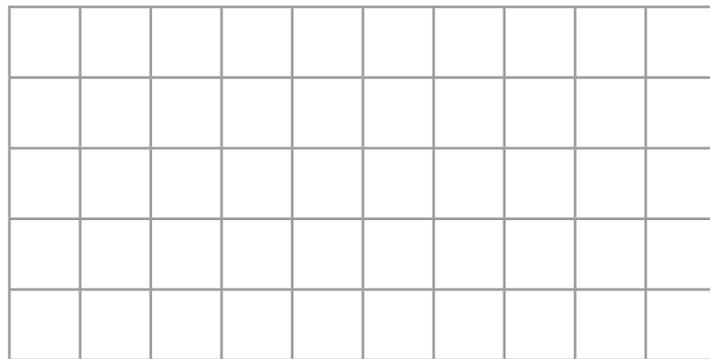

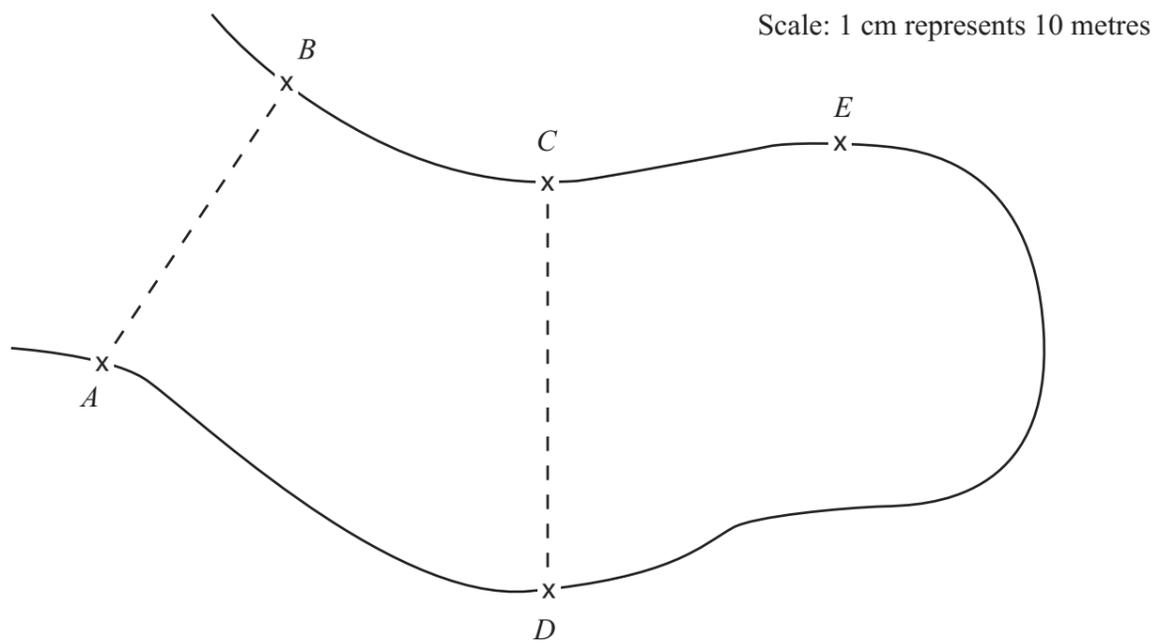


21 The map shows part of a lake.

The scale of the map is 1 cm represents 10 metres.

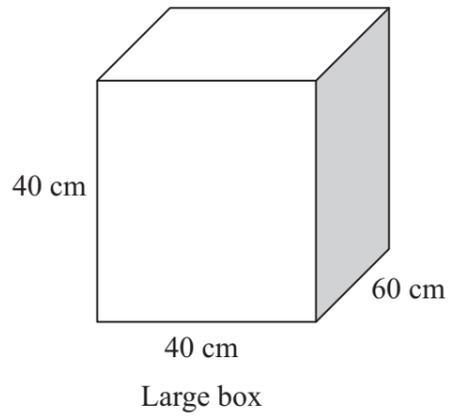
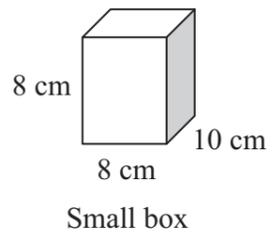

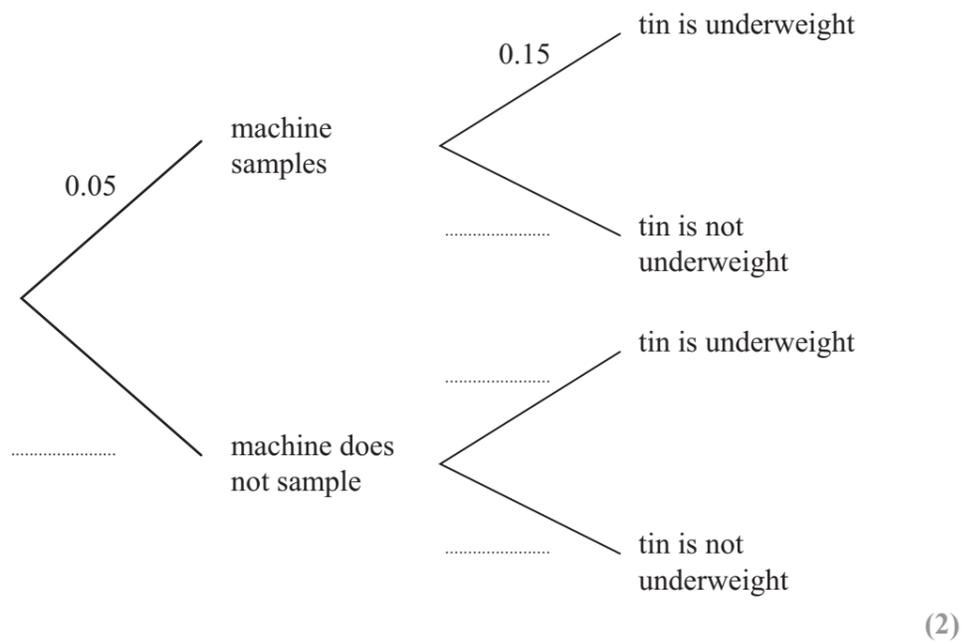

When a tin is sampled and found to be underweight the company will be fined.

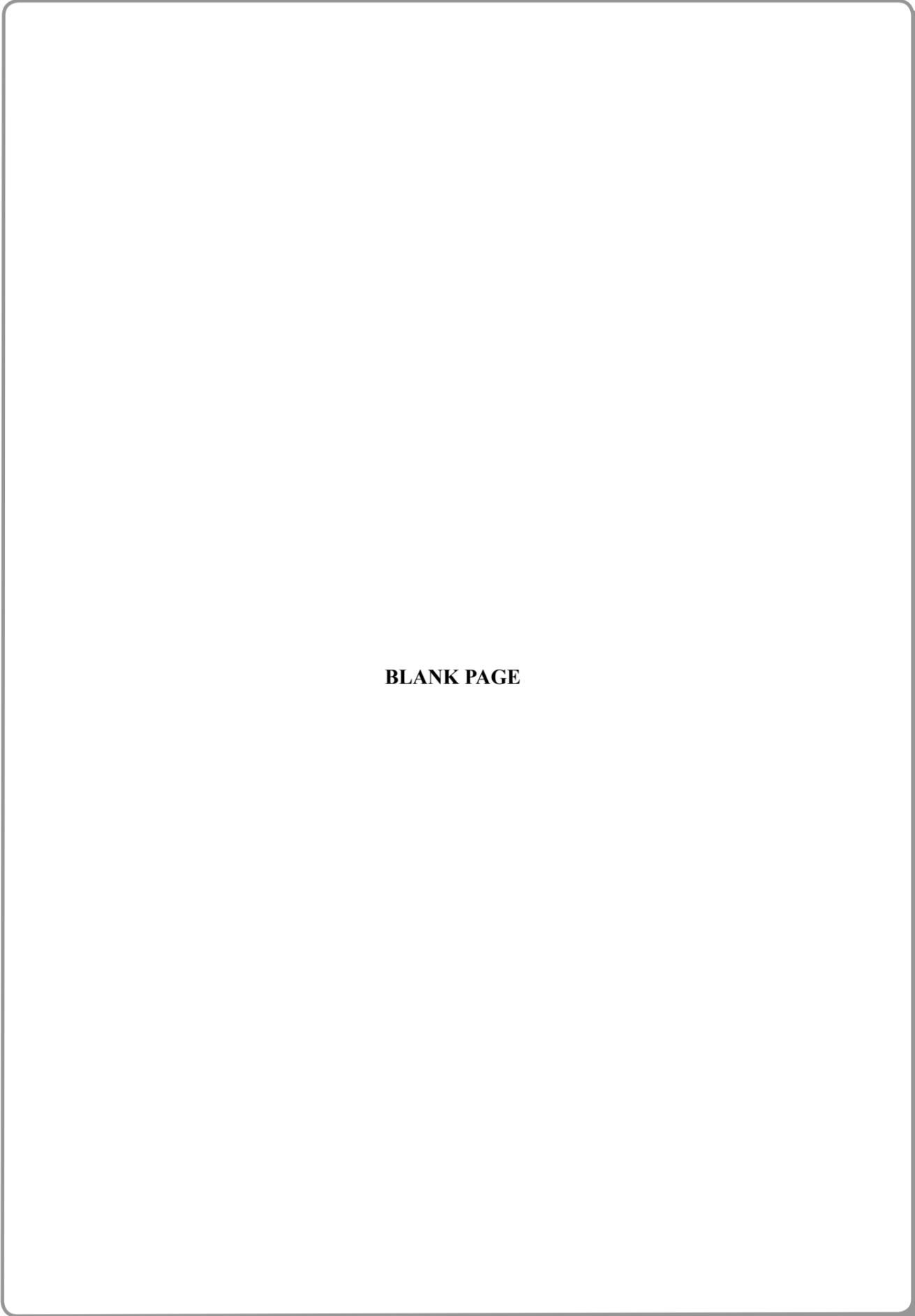
