- Prescribed poems from a post-2000 anthology
- One post-2000 novel chosen from a prescribed list
- Open book examination.

Overview of assessment

💮 Length: **2 hours**

Section A Poetry:

- Students answer **one** essay question from a choice of two on their studied prescribed poems
- Both essay questions will be comparative with one named poem from the studied text, plus a free choice of second poem from the prescribed list.
- The named poems will be printed on the question paper

Section B Prose:

• Students answer **one** essay question from a choice of two on their studied prose text.

- Open book examination.

 Students answer **one** essay question from a choice of two on their other studied drama text.

💮 Length: **2 hours**

Section A Poetry:

- Students answer **one** essay question on unprepared poetry
- The unprepared poem will be printed on the question paper

Section B Prose:

• Students answer **one** comparative essay question from a choice of two on the two studied prose texts from their chosen theme.

Shakespeare and pre-1900 Poetry:

- One Shakespeare play chosen from the prescribed list
- One specified collection of poems chosen from one prescribed literary movement
- Open book examination.

Section B Pre-1900 Poetry

- Metaphysical Poets: prescribed poems from a pre published Metaphysical Poetry anthology
- The Victorians: prescribed poems from a pre published Victorian Verse anthology
- The Romantics: prescribed poems from a pre published English Romantic Verse anthology

💮 Length: **2 hours**

Section A Shakespeare play:

• Students answer **one** essay question from a choice of two on their studied play.

Section B Pre-1900 Poetry:

- Students answer **one** essay question from a choice of two on their selected movement
- The named poems will be printed on the question paper
