


Think Again

The new grade 9 is more valuable than the A* because it's awarded to fewer students than A*, with top performing students now being awarded three grades (9, 8 and 7), rather than two grades (A* and A). So under the new system, a smaller proportion of students are awarded a grade 9.

What is the (9–1) grading scale?

The new nine point grading scale (9–1) was introduced by the UK government to raise standards and recognise top performing students.

Why should my school move to International GCSE (9–1)?

This year, over 5 million GCSEs and International GCSEs will be awarded using the 9–1 grading scale, making it the most used and recognised grading scale for GCSE and International GCSE.

By moving to the new 9–1 grading scale, you ensure that your choice of International GCSE is most closely aligned to the British curriculum so students can successfully progress to GCE A level, International A Level and to university.

Is moving to the revised specification difficult?

Change is never easy, so we've kept it to a minimum. We worked closely with educators while we were developing our new International GCSEs, and made sure we kept all the things that made them great, and only made small changes based on what you.


Access to Scripts in numbers, Summer 2018



What is the Access to Scripts service and how do I use it?

- It is a self-service portal via Pearson Edexcel Online giving you instant access to scripts.
- The online portal allows you to view your candidates' marked scripts online or download as a PDF.
- You will be able to evaluate how your candidates performed on particular questions and how that is reflected in their final grade.
- It will help you to identify skills gaps so you can tailor future teaching plans.
- You can use the Access to Scripts service to help decide if you wish to request a review of marking.




**International




