	(Opening balance) - cash position at the start of a period/month/balance bought forward	
	(Income) - money flowing into the business	
	(Expenditure) - money flowing out of the business	
	(Net cash flow) - the difference between money in and money out in a period/month	
	(Closing balance) - cash position at the end of a period/month/balance carried over	(5)

T(b)	eg a range of sandwiches is required - one filling at a time then the next no longer pre-ordered - fillings are known for each day scale of production has increased - six days a week/12 supermarkets - quality control if initial business is kept running then may still need job and batch	(5)

1(c)	(AO3 - Select/Analyse = 5)	
	eg a £ was worth two \$ - goods bought in New York were effectively cheaper for British customers - they got more dollars to the pound - New York prices more competitive	
	theoretically USA imported goods to Britain should have been cheaper - this was not the case - availability of cheap flight to New York	(5)

1(d)	eg store growth - from one in 1976 to 2,045 in 2005 began in UK - becomes worldwide - trades in 39 countries introduction of direct selling in 1994 - wider markets/more potential customers success recognised - listing on LSE - aids growth through increased capital increase in numbers involved in business - suppliers/customers/employees/shareholders customer satisfaction - customer loyalty - across the world success leads to a takeover in 2006	(5)

2(b)	eg a new product - no competition - innovative - likely to be a high demand - interest consumers and customers - supply unlikely in this phase to meet that demand - high price may be short term - chance to recoup some R&D costs - price can be lowered when necessary - similar products from other manufacturers - supply begins to meet demand

2(c)	(AO3 - Analyse = 5)  eg desk is made of raw materials - wood and metal - one needs cutting down the other mining - then both require transportation to next activity area  wood has to be processed - ore has to be turned into metal - then each is used to manufacture the desk  once manufactured desk has to be sold to end	
	user via a retailer  all activity areas will require the services of banks and insurance companies	(5)

2(d)	(AO4 - Evaluate = 5)	
	eg salary/job security/relationships/supervisors/working conditions/rules/policies	
	hygiene factors surround the job but are not the job - all can be causes of dissatisfaction/bad feelings - all need to be addressed by managers - if this is done then employees will be satisfied and happy in their work to the benefit of the business	
	hygiene factors do not make people work better - but they do remove problems that would make workers unhappy	(5)
