

Participation in elections

Montserrat

Being able to vote is an important aspect of global citizenship. In 2014 there were over 100 elections around the world. More than 1.5 billion people voted in these elections. There are large differences in the numbers of people who vote in elections in some countries compared to others.

In some countries, the percentage of people who vote (which is also called turnout) is high. In Denmark 80% of the population usually votes in elections. In Australia, where voting is compulsory, turnout is even higher at around 94%. The highest percentage was in North Korea, where the government said that almost no one missed the chance to vote.

These percentages hide large variations in the actual numbers of people voting. In Montserrat, fewer than 3,000 people voted but this is approximately 75% of those who had the right to vote. In India, by contrast, 500 million people voted in the presidential election - this is approximately 66% of those who had the right to vote.

Election data showed that turnout in Afghanistan was approximately 39%.
