Kwa kawaida wachezaji hucheza kwa miguu na huruhusiwa kutumia sehemu nyingine za mwili isipokuwa mikono. Mlinda goli ndiye mwenye tofauti kuu, ingawa kama mpira unarushwa kutoka nje ya uwanja wachezaji huruhusiwa kutumia mikono.

Ijapokuwa mchezo huu hucheza na wanaume zaidi ya wanawake; wanawake pia wanaupenda mno. Tena, kuna timu nyingi sana za wanawake za mpira wa miguu duniani.
