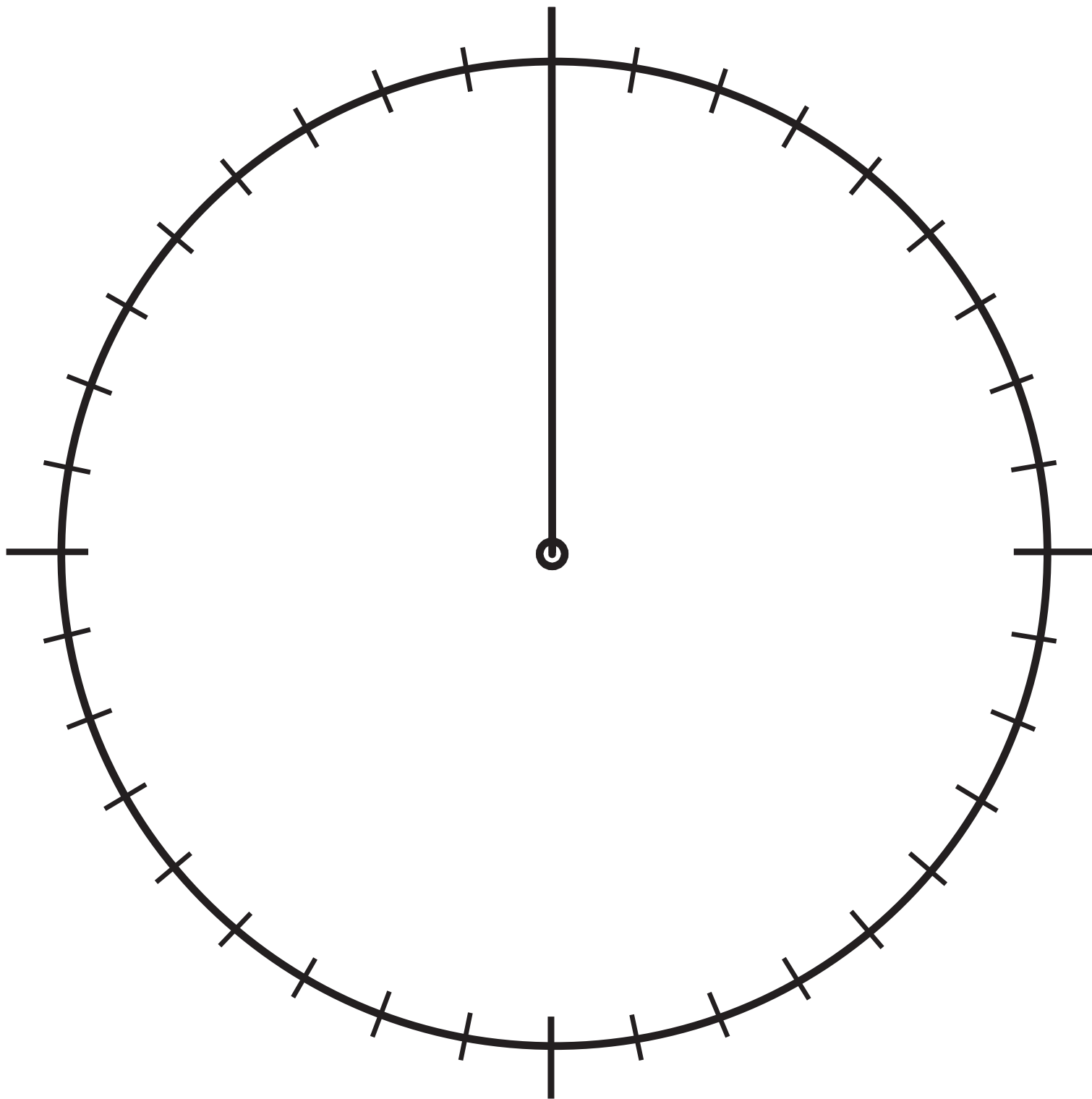

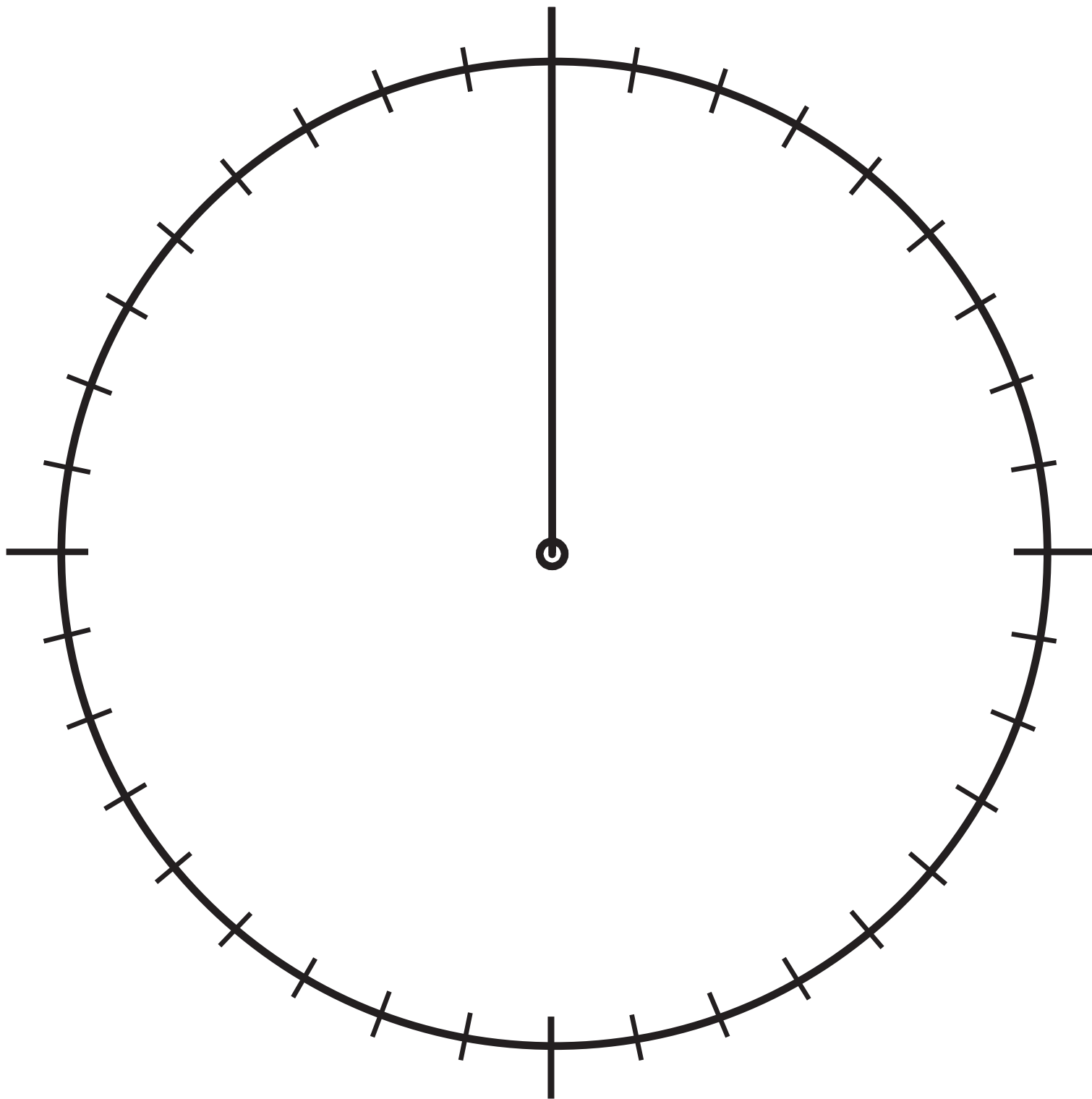
Question 2(h)

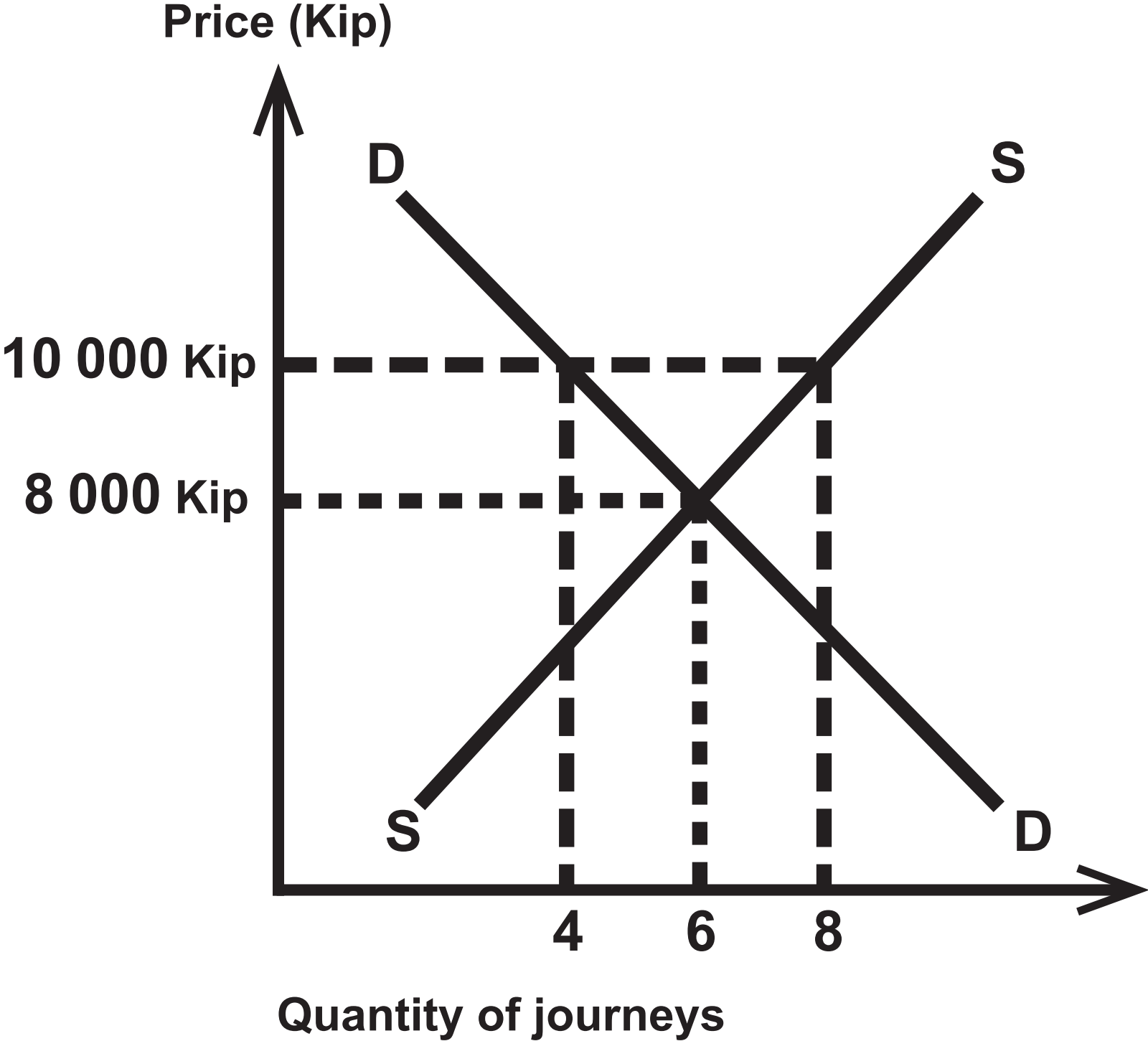

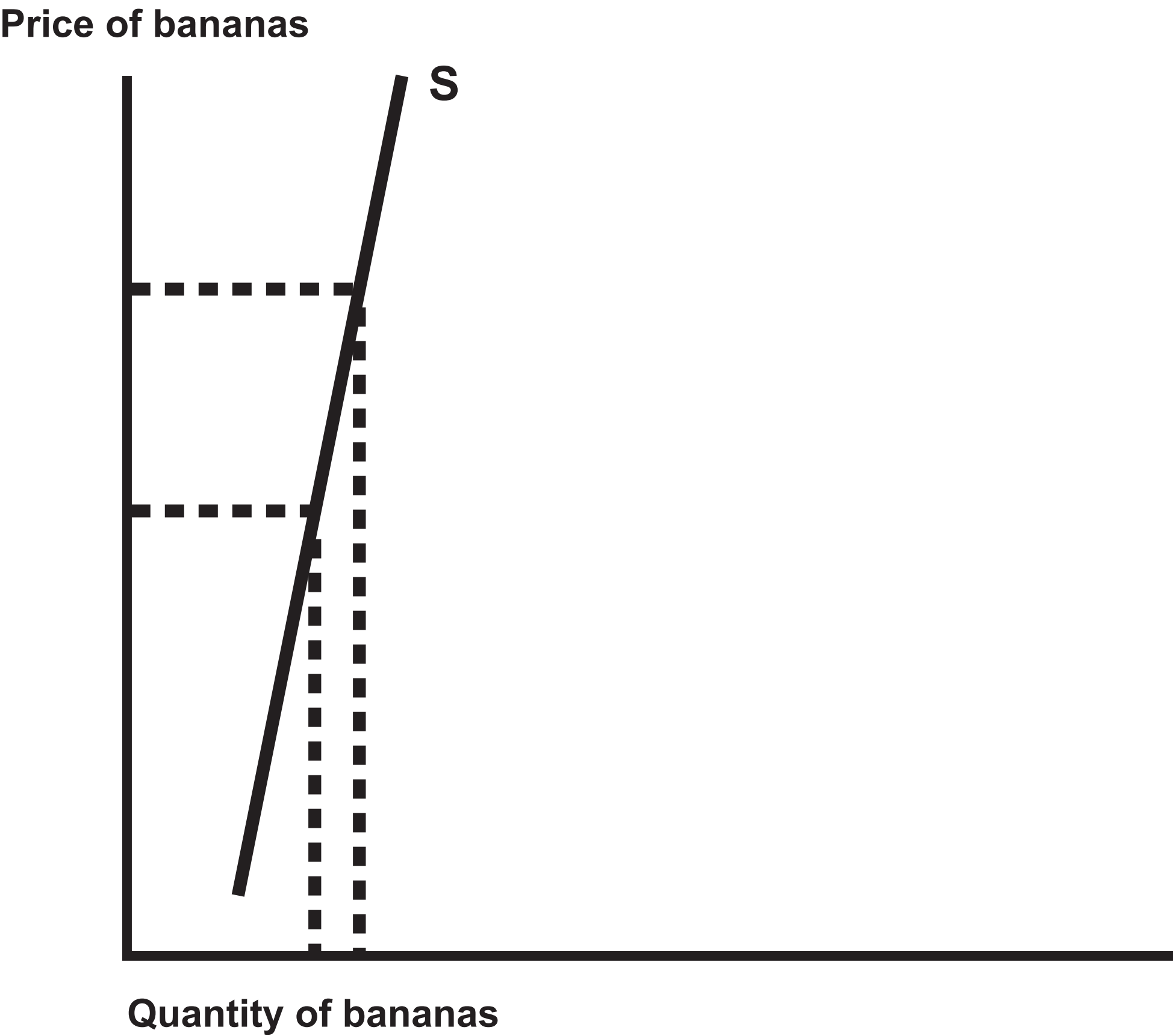

Monthly Spanish minimum wage increases
