3	Literal Comprehension Purple A/B	Answer literal questions about books they have listened to or read, using new vocabulary they have met in the text.	Asteroids	1	A guess not connected with the text	Re-read the text. What does it tell us about what the astronaut sees out of the window?
4	Inference: Making Inferences Purple A/B	Participate in discussions about books they have listened to or read, making simple inferences on the basis of what characters do.	He hopes the rocket can fly around the asteroids without hitting them.	1	Any incorrect answer	Re-read the text. What is happening when the astronaut says, 'I hope the rocket swerves'?

5	Literal Comprehension: Literal Comprehension Purple A/B	Answer literal questions about books they have listened to or read, using new vocabulary they have met in the text.	The asteroids have damaged it.	1	Any incorrect answer	This isn't the problem that the text tells us about. What problem is mentioned in the text?
6	Language for Effect: Literary Language Purple A/B	Recognise rhymes or alliteration in poems they have listened to or read.	Sight	1	Alternative word that doesn't rhyme	Words that rhyme have the same sound at the end. Which word on the page rhymes with 'white'?
7	Literal Comprehension: Sequencing Purple A/B	Retell recently read stories, including main characters and most key events, in correct order with minimal prompting.	Next, the rocket took off. Then the rocket landed on a planet.  (Or similar appropriate answers)  (Award 1 mark for each correct sentence.)	2	Answers that do not show an understanding of the sequence of events	Re-read the text. Think about what happened and when.
8	Responding to the Text: Personal Response and Evaluation of the Text Purple A/B	With some support, explain and discuss their understanding of books, poems and other material in simple terms.	Accept any answer that relates to something that might be surprising. For example: that the astronaut turns out to be an alien, or that human children help him to mend his rocket.	1	An answer that doesn't include something surprising	Read the poem again. Did anything in the poem surprise you?  Did you think it was surprising that the astronaut was an alien, and the 'aliens' turned out to be humans?
